

# County Treasurer Jordan Makes Financial Report

Figures Show Receipts and Expenditures for Nine Months Preceding July 1---Bend Taxes \$3,973.78 and School District Was \$19,078.88.

County Treasurer Jordan has prepared a statement of the business of his office covering the nine months from October 1, 1912, to July 1, 1913. In that time he has taken in slightly over half a million dollars and disbursed all but about \$78,000, as the figures show. The amount of taxes for the city of Bend is the highest for the county, being \$3,973.78, as against \$3,667.52 for Prineville, the next highest in the list. The taxes received from school district No. 12, in which Bend is situated, are shown to be \$19,078.88, the next highest being district No. 1, including Prineville, with a total of \$7,923.52. District No. 59, covering Redmond, has paid \$1,823.48, and No. 53, or Laidlaw, \$217.85. The complete statement, except for the details of the different school districts, is as follows:

## APPOINTEES ARE ANNOUNCED

### PANAMA-PACIFIC COMMISSION

W. Lair Thompson of Lakeview One of Five Men to Have Charge of the Oregon Exhibit at San Francisco Big International Exposition.

SALEM, July 7.—Four members of the committee appointed by the last Legislature to name the members of the Oregon Panama-Pacific exposition commission met in Salem last Saturday and appointed Senator C. L. Hawley of Polk county, Robert A. Thompson of Lake county and O. M. Clark and John F. Logan of Multnomah. These five will have supervision of the expenditure of \$175,000 appropriated for the Oregon building and exhibit at the San Francisco fair in 1915.

The committee made the appointments in secret session. Governor West did not attend the meeting. Those present were Secretary of State Olcott, State Treasurer Kay, Dan Malarky, president of the Senate, and C. N. McArthur, speaker of the House.

A "universal eight-hour work day for men and women" is proposed in an initiative petition filed with the secretary of state last week by Mrs. Jean Bennett of Portland. The measure provides for an eight-hour day in every industry. The petition has 11,136 names. The measure will be submitted to the voters at the 1914 election. Mrs. Bennett said its supporters did not expect to win at that time, but they would keep on trying.

## DIMICK TO RUN OIL PLANT

Standard Oil Station Will Be in Operation by July 15.

About July 15, when the new Standard Oil plant here goes into commission, J. W. Dimick will take charge of it. Mr. Dimick saw seven years' service with the Standard at Portland and Astoria, at the latter place having been in charge of a new station as he will be here.

The new plant includes a warehouse, wagon shed, pump house, barn and three 20,000-gallon tanks. It will be the chief Standard distributing station for all Central Oregon, making Bend the central oil distributing point for the two large companies, as the United Warehouse is handling the Union Oil Company's products.
