

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE CROOK COUNTY COURT

In the commissioners' court of the state of Oregon for the county of Crook, July term, 1913. July 2.

County roads—Petition of C. D. Preston et al for bridge on Preston road over Dry Canyon granted. Ordered that the county surveyor examine the location and estimate the cost of construction; that the petitioners obtain bids for lumber to be used and that the county judge let the contract for the lumber.

Petition of Ora Van Tassel et al for county road—First reading.

R. A. Merchant road—No claim for damages having been filed, the road is hereby ordered opened.

Ovid B. Riley, Slemore and Paulina Creek and Powell Butte roads—Ordered continued.

Ora Van Tassel petition for license for warehouse at Vanora on right of way of the Oregon Trunk Railway—Ordered that when the petitioners file a proper bond in the sum of \$1000 approved by the county judge the petition shall be granted.

Claim of Supt. J. E. Myers for stamps—Ordered that \$40 be placed at the disposal of Supt. J. E. Myers for stamps.

Plat of Pinelyn Park approved. Clerk instructed to make order in regular form.

Plat of Cascade Park approved. Clerk instructed to make order in regular form.

G. W. Raper, petition for liquor license in town of La Pine, unincorporated, Ireland precinct—Whereas petition appeared regular in every respect, ordered petition granted.

Resignation of Ward Coble, Justice of the Peace of Bend—Resignation accepted.

Semi-annual report of county treasurer, R. L. Jordan, read and approved.

Oregon Trunk Railway petition to be released from bond in the matter of R. M. Elder road—Granted.

In the matter of Grace M. Bassett, widow, ordered, when petitioner has perfected her petition by affixing her signature and the same has been approved by the county judge, the prayer of said petition shall be granted and the county clerk ordered to draw a warrant in favor of said petitioner in the sum of \$10 dated July 1, 1913, and it is further ordered that the said county clerk draw a warrant in favor of the said Grace M. Bassett, widow, in the sum of \$10 on the first day of every calendar month thereafter.

Claim of Wenanay Livery Company for \$36.25—Ordered disallowed for the reason that the county has paid the sum of \$100 for the recovery of bodies from the Deschutes river which sum is all it pledged itself to pay for such recovery.

Claim of Frank Elkins, county sheriff, for \$28.18 for gasoline for county automobile disallowed.

In the matter of the application of the city of Prineville for refund of taxes, continued pending action of the district attorney.

Application of W. H. Melrose for rebate of taxes on wrongful assessment, allowed \$35.82.

Application of George A. Stephens for rebate of the unearned portion of his liquor license, allowed \$31.10.

M. A. Gulick road—First reading of viewers' report on resurvey of road.

July 3.

Indian Ford road—Report of viewers read and approved, ordered recorded.

C. J. Mock road—Final report made, road ordered opened, clerk instructed to make proper order opening road as a public highway.

M. A. Gulick road—Viewers' report read the second time, road ordered opened as a public highway, clerk instructed to draw proper order opening road and to order the proper supervisor to proceed at once.

C. M. Elkins—Petition presented for private change in Lower Bridge road—Ordered that the viewers be instructed to view and survey the same and report on the first day of the regular September term of this court.

Ora Van Tassel road—Petition read the second time, ordered referred to the district attorney.

E. M. Eby road—Whereas all proceedings appear to be regular and proper form as required by law, ordered that the viewers proceed to view, survey and locate said road as described in the petition filed in this court.

In the matter of the vacation of the plat of Mayfield addition to Madras—Petition of Central Oregon Investment Company, continued.

Claim of Jacob N. Quiborg disallowed.

Claim for damages by Chas. H. Spangh and I. E. Wimer because of the location of the C. Peterson road—Whereas it appeared to the commissioners' court that the land claimed to be damaged was more valuable with the road as located than it was without, ordered that the claim for damages be disallowed.

the same to be reviewed by the commissioners at the next regular session of the commissioners' court.

Lord's Oregon Laws—Whereas the Circuit Court of this district has been hampered in its proceedings in this county by reason of the shortage of codes, it is hereby ordered that the clerk be instructed to draw a warrant in favor of the secretary of state of the state of Oregon in the sum of \$27.60 in payment of two sets of Lord's Oregon Laws for use during the sessions of the circuit court.
