

NINE LODGES IN BEND SHOW STRONG FRATERNAL SPIRIT

The fraternal spirit in Bend is strong, as evidenced by the number of lodges which exist here. In all, there are nine of them. During the past year, a new meeting place for them was provided in Sather's Hall, this being a notable improvement over the hall formerly in use. The Modern Woodmen was the first lodge to be established here, being founded on March 22, 1894. The charter list showed 21 members. It meets every Tuesday evening in Sather's Hall. The chief officers are: W. W. Orcutt, consul; M. R. Knutson, clerk.

Affiliated with the Woodmen is the Royal Neighbors of America, this lodge being instituted April 20, 1911, with 21 charter members. It meets in Sather's hall on the first and third Friday evenings of each month. The principal officers are Mrs. Margaret Bates, oracle, and Mrs. A. Orcutt, recorder.

The Bend lodge of Masons was chartered June 17, 1909. It holds its meetings once a month in its hall in the building on Wall street owned by C. W. Annot. The regular meeting night is Thursday. The Independent Order of Odd Fellows is represented in Bend by three

branches—the Subordinate lodge, Encampment and Rebekahs. The Subordinate lodge meets in Sather's Hall every Monday evening. It was instituted here on June 20, 1910. The local lodge of Knights of Pythias was instituted March 14, 1897, with a charter membership of 15. The meeting night is Wednesday, the place being Sather's Hall. Flower Show is Held Annually

In addition to its activities in behalf of the Bend public library, as told elsewhere in this issue, the Ladies' Library Club conducts an annual flower show. This event not only aids in creating interest in growing flowers which beautify the yards of the town but also furnishes over-

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whelming proof of the success that can be attained in a climate some times thought to be unfavorable to flower growing.

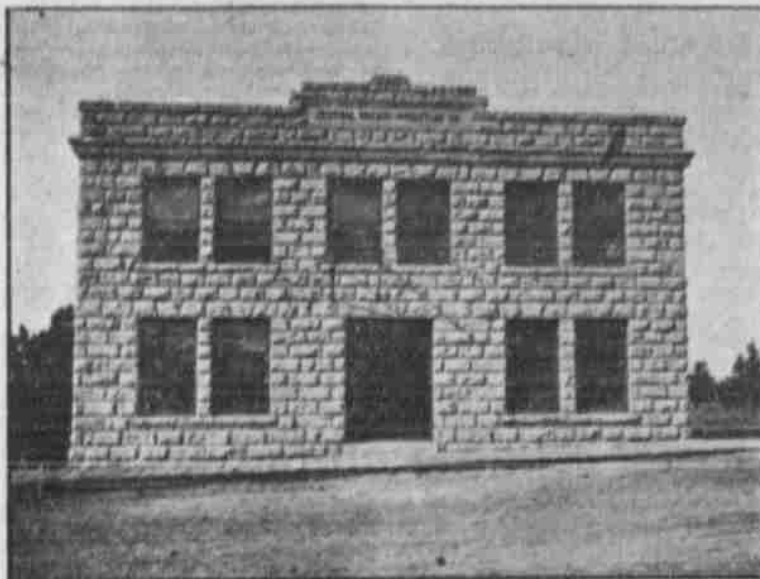
At the first exhibit under the auspices of the club, in 1911, a creditable showing was made. At the exhibit last year, however, held on August 17, an unusually good display was seen, with nearly 500 entries. Among the flowers shown at that time were sweet peas, roses, nasturtiums, pansies, geraniums, carnations, asters, verbenas, marigolds, fuschias, Shasta daisies and coreopsis. Prizes were

given for the best displays of the different varieties and in addition there were special prizes for the best children's display, and for vegetables.

Among the prizes was a silver cup offered by the Emblem Club for the best general display, the cup to become the property of the winner in this class for three successive years. The cup is now held by Mrs. E. W. Richardson, the winner in 1912.

The date for this year's show has not yet been set. It will be some time in August, and a large number of entries is expected.

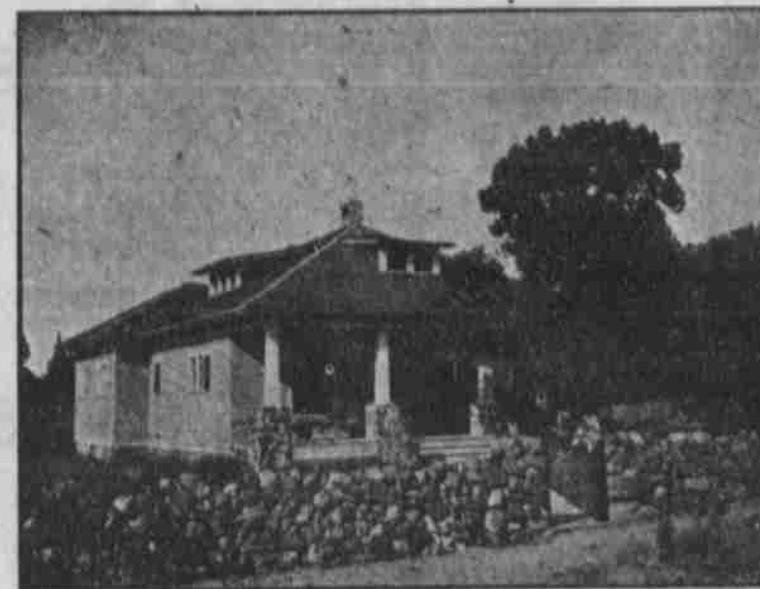
