

# CHANGE IN HIGH SCHOOL COURSE

## MORE LIBERALITY ALLOWED

Students Who Are Able Can Complete Work in Three Years. Credit for Music Study Also Will be Given.

(Special to The Bulletin) SALEM, Aug. 18.—It will be possible for high school students who are mentally and physically strong enough to carry five studies a year instead of four to complete a high school course in three years, according to the new regulations just prescribed by State School Superintendent J. A. Churchill and being sent to the principals of the high schools of the state with the new courses of study.

Another innovation adopted by Superintendent Churchill is to allow a high school student to study music, either vocal or instrumental, outside of school and be given full credit for it in school. Fifteen credits are required for graduation from a high school. A student may earn from one to three credits for music. While studying music a pupil will be permitted to take one less study in school.

"My experience in high school work years ago led me to believe an injustice was being done pupils who had a talent for instrumental or vocal music, and were not permitted to develop it because of the rigid high school course which recognized no value in any subject taught outside the prescribed studies of the course," said Superintendent Churchill. "Many a voice that might have been a joy to the possessor and his friends by entertaining, or by assisting in worship, has been hushed by the inability of the pupil to find time to practice."

Under the new high school courses a pupil is given greater freedom of selection than ever allowed before in this state. The old idea that the high school course must be made to fit the entrance requirements of the colleges has been relegated to the scrap heap, and Mr. Churchill says that the state has been emancipated from college dominance. Instead of trying to fit all pupils to one course, the courses are now being fitted to the pupils and are being made practical.

**New Fair Buildings.** Three new buildings are being erected at the state fair grounds and will be ready for the fair this year. They are a machinery hall, a eugenics hall, and a building for the children's industrial department. Secretary Frank Meredith states that practically all the space in the exhibit pavilion and the machinery hall has been asked for and the overflow will have to be taken care of in tents. Indications are the exhibits will be larger and greater in number.
