

# STATE'S VOTERS NEARLY DOUBLE

## WOMAN SUFFRAGE IS RESPONSIBLE

Assistant Secretary of State Estimates Number Will Reach About 800,000—Attorney General Renders Opinions on New Laws.

SALEM, Aug. 25.—That the total registration in the state will jump from 160,000, the number registered prior to the general election in 1912, to 250,000 or 300,000 before the next primary election which will be held the third Friday in May, 1914, is the estimate of Assistant Secretary of State S. A. Koser. Just what portion of this increase will be due to woman suffrage will be interesting information, which Koser suggests might be ascertained if the county clerks will report to the Secretary of State's office the sex of the voters who register.

Since the new permanent registration law went into effect 11,791 voters have registered, according to the reports of the county clerks.

**Grammar Grade Courses Changed.**  
Changes in the new course of study for the grammar grades of the public schools, as prepared by State Superintendent J. A. Churchill, are along the same progressive lines as shown by the changes recently announced in the new high school course.

"Training for good citizenship and efficiency is the keynote," declared Mr. Churchill, "of the new course of study in the grades." In this year's course of study he is paving the way for a complete course in manners and morals, which he says have been neglected. The new course embodies a distinct course in civil government for the first time. The study of hygiene is given an important place, the idea being that a child cannot become an efficient citizen unless he has a sound body.

**Interprets Divorce Laws.**

A divorced person cannot legally remarry in this state within six months following the date of the divorce, but he may go into another state where remarriage is permitted in less time than that and get married and then return to Oregon and the marriage will be held legal in this state, according to an opinion of the attorney general given last week. He also held that a physician cannot charge more than \$2.50 for issuing the marriage medical certificate which is required to be obtained by prospective bridegrooms.

**New Law Affects Banks.**

Last week the attorney general rendered an opinion that all banks having a clause in their articles of incorporation authorizing them to do a trust company business must either comply with the new trust company law or have their articles amended. If a bank has the word "trust" in its name it must comply with this new law or have the word stricken out. The new statute provides for a heavy deposit of securities with the state treasurer by all trust companies for the protection of their patrons.

**Corporations Must Pay Fees.**  
All corporations in the state which have not paid their annual license fees will have suits instituted

against them after September 5, according to an announcement made by Corporation Commissioner Watson. These suits will be to collect the amount of the annual fee and a penalty of \$100. Corporation Commissioner Watson has stated also that he will give investment corporations only until September 5 to file their preliminary statements, after which time he will prosecute any such corporations doing business without a permit. He has now given such corporations three months in which to file their preliminary statements.
