

MANY CLUSTER LIGHTS.

Following the announcement of Manager Foley of the Bend Water, Light & Power Co. of a plan to make a Great White Way in Bend comes the movement of property owners on Bond, Oregon and Wall streets, now being carried out, to give those streets a lighting system of the most modern kind by the installation of cluster lights. Three of these lights were put in on Bond and Oregon streets by the First National Bank on the completion of its new building last winter and two have just been set up in front of the Mutzig building on Oregon. Other property owners are now joining the movement and fixtures have been ordered by Hugh O'Kane for the Bend Hotel and by the Deschutes Investment Company, R. M. Smith, O'Donnell Bros, N. P. Smith, Coe & Hudson, E. A. Sather, H. H. Davies, J. H. Qneil and R. P. Minter, representing Dr. L. H. Kermott, to be set up in front of their buildings on Wall street in all here will be 19 of these new lights, with the prospect of more to be put in by other property owners.
