

# COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

A regular term of the County Court convened on November 5, 1913, at 11 o'clock a. m. thereof. Present: G. Springer, judge, presiding; R. H. Bayley, commissioner; Willis W. Brown, commissioner; Frank Elkins, sheriff, and Warren Brown, clerk.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the G. L. Braze et al county road. Viewers' report presented, read and approved; said report being unfavorable the matter was discontinued.

In the matter of the George Kesler road, continued for reconsideration.

In the matter of the L. A. Hunt et al road, viewers' report read twice, viz., on November 5 and 6 and viewers were requested to amend report conforming to plat filed by Attorney Dagget, the same being desired by a majority of the original petitioners. Ordered to meet on December 10, 1913.

In the matter of the D. Frank et al road, viewers ordered out on December 4, 1913.

In the matter of the L. W. Long road in consideration of the fact that the citizens have subscribed \$150, ordered that warrant for \$250 be drawn in favor of Roy Newell, to be used in improving said road.

Road Supervisor Monroe's report accepted in the matter of the Gateway grade, and R. L. Jordan instructed to pay said supervisor \$650, balance of railroad contribution. Clerk ordered to issue warrant for \$134.25 to Supervisor Monroe, the same being the amount expended more than the railroad contribution, viz., total cost \$1701.52, less \$1175 worth of material culverts and powder left over.

In the matter of the report of P. T. Monroe, supervisor of road district No. 10, Cross Keys, report approved and warrant for \$11.25 ordered drawn in favor of said supervisor.

In the matter of Hillman road district No. 24, George Hamilton, supervisor, clerk ordered to draw warrant for \$250 in favor of said Hamilton in lieu of warrants drawn for John Helfrich, which warrants are ordered withheld.

In the matter of the report of Allen Wilcox, supervisor of road district No. 25, report approved and warrant for \$452.55 ordered drawn.

In the matter of the Dan Catlow road, all proceedings appearing to be regular, the viewers were ordered out on December 8, 1913.

In the matter of the J. A. Voeburg road, all proceedings appearing regular, the viewers were ordered out on December 5, 1913.

In the matter of the S. F. Santerson road, all proceedings appearing to be regular, viewers ordered out on November 14, 1913.

In the matter of the M. M. Davenport road, viewers' report presented and read twice, viz., on November 5 and 6, and same having been approved by District Attorney Wirtz, ordered that M. M. Davenport be instructed to work out subscription.

In the matter of the S. E. West road; and it appearing that the petitioners are willing to build said road without cost to the county, and it also appearing that the Roy Kidder road will cost \$500 to open, it is therefore requested that the viewers reconsider their report on said S. E. West road and it is understood that the county will endeavor to legalize the same.

In the matter of the H. G. Thorstrup road, Supervisor Peters authorized to do a little work on the bridge, not exceeding \$10, and the county will furnish one box of powder to be used by subscribers under the direction of the supervisor.

**November 5.**  
Viewers report in the matter of the M. C. Meithe, the E. W. Pershall and the W. A. ... roads, presented and read twice, viz., on November 5 and 6, and approved.

In the matter of the D. H. Yeoman, Geo. F. Euston and A. H. Williams roads, viewers granted further time.

In the matter of the P. D. Scamman road, viewers' report presented, read twice, viz., on November 6 and 7, and approved.

In the matter of the claim of F. P. ... for damages, disallowed.

In the matter of the culverts for the Gateway road; it appearing that Commissioner Brown purchased on his own account for said road culverts to the value of \$168.75, it is ordered that a warrant be drawn in favor of said Brown to cover said amount.

In the matter of the J. O. McKinney road, all proceedings being regular, viewers ordered to meet and view out said road on December 10, 1913.

In the matter of the Prineville-Silver Lake road, via Millican's and Walker's Cabin to the south county line, ordered that warrant for \$250 be issued to W. F. King who is hereby appointed to superintend the removing of the surface rocks and placing guide boards along said road.

Eleanor Barnett appropriation increased to \$40 per month.

The following roads were ordered re-surveyed and recorded: change in Don P. Rea road; W. C. Congleton road; C. J. Bonquist road extension and change in the Wm. Brownhill road.

Miss C. Beasley ordered \$300 for right of way of road across her place, that amount being agreed upon in open court.

In the matter of the report of W. E. Claypool, road supervisor of district No. 35 and 37, report approved and allowed \$524.90.

**November 10.**  
In the matter of the completion of the floor of the basement of the Court House, being 2700 square feet, complete same quality cement work, as well as foot of front approach, also office room in northeast corner of basement 15 1/2 feet square for \$813, awarded to Shipp and Perry.

Contract for painting court house as per specifications in sheriff's office, let to Shipp and Perry.

In the matter for the petition for assistance for the Holt family, matter referred to the judge.

In the matter of widows' pensions and assistance for indigent persons, ordered warrants be issued monthly.

In the matter of the bill of O. G. Adams for \$37.95, same was continued for segregation.

Whereas, many bills are presented not endorsed, it is ordered that officials must O. K. bills for goods, etc. ordered by them.

In the matter of the Crook County Fair, directors appointed for 1914: J. W. Brewer, J. W. Wright, J. N. Williamson. Requested to meet as soon as possible to appoint superintendent and re-arrange premium list.

In the matter of the vacation of Perryville, plat approved and clerk instructed to make proper order.

In the matter of widows' pensions, re Sylvia Kinney and Janette Lattin, reviewed for the reason that at former consideration part of the board was absent; now board all being present, approved. Petition of Frances M. Clark denied because of non-residence.

In the matter of the treasurer's report, approved.

In the matter of change in Pearl M. Pruett road, surveyor's report approved and change ordered.

In regard to the communication from W. A. Bell regarding claims of City of Prineville, referred to Council Attorney Wirtz with request that Mr. Wirtz take care of the county's interest in the matter.
