

NOTABLE DAY AT LAIDLAW

BIG THANKSGIVING CELEBRATION

Attendance at Shooting Tournament and Dance Large—C. P. Becker Carries off Honors as Marksmen—Another Entertainment

The shooting tournament and dance at Laidlaw on Thanksgiving proved to be a great entertaining feature and drew a large attendance from all the surrounding towns. Bend was there with a tremendous crowd, especially in the evening for the dance. The entire affair was very enjoyable and successful. During the day was held the shooting, and this was participated in by more than 50 entrants. The honors of the day were carried off by Chauncey P. Becker, who proved himself a good marksman. For the highest average of the day he won \$10 in gold. He also was at the top for the highest general average with not less than 50 blue rocks. He broke 65 and missed 17, giving a percentage of 89. E. C. Landingham, the Deschutes hotel man, was second with 51 broken and 19 missed, a percentage of 73. In the Tumble Club shootoff C. P. Becker was first, E. C. Landingham second and T. G. Becker third.

The dance in the evening was in charge of the west side ladies and was held in the new hall. The spacious floor was ample for the large crowd that was present, and good music was furnished by an orchestra from Bend and a player piano which was installed for the occasion free of charge by E. C. Landingham. Bend people who were at the dance state that there were more than 150 couples dancing, and the gayeties lasted far into the morning hours.

SILVER LAKE FORMERLY FREIGHTED 230 MILES

F. M. Chrisman Tells of Days When Four Cents a Pound was Rate for Haul from the Dalles.

F. M. Chrisman of Silver Lake tells some tall tales of freighting to his town in the old days, when a round trip from the Dalles took about 40 days, and 4 cents a pound for the 230-mile haul was usual. Anyone will admit that with that haul and that freight rate, the high cost of living, not to mention the cost of high living, must have been pretty steep in Chrisman's halibut in the 90's. The old trail was by way of Shearer's Bridge, Lake Owyhee, Cow Creek, Hay Creek, Prineville, Bear Creek, Butte and Button Spring, when Prineville was the only town on the route.

Then, when the Columbia Southern was built, freighting was done from Shaniko, a mere matter of 175 miles, with a rate from 1 1/4 to 3 cents a pound. Next was Madras, as the Deschutes roads built, and now Bend, only 88 miles distant. The present rate varies from 90 cents to \$1.00 a hundred.

CRENSHAW SUES 'MOST EVERYONE IN REDMOND'

Inate Minister Would Collect \$67,500 Damages From People Who, He Alleges, Labeled Him There.

PRINEVILLE, Dec. 1.—If Bend people think everyone in town has been subpoenaed to appear at court this week, they may be comforted by knowing that Redmond is pretty well represented also. For the famous, or infamous, case of J. M. Crenshaw versus almost-everyone-in-Redmond is scheduled for trial, whether or not it actually gets a hearing.

Crenshaw, the minister who stirred up so much trouble at Redmond last year, is suing 15 Redmond citizens for \$60,000 and the owners of the Redmond Spoken for \$17,500, all for alleged libelous and damaging statements, etc., directed against him. The defendants are H. H. and C. L. Palmer, J. W. Brewer, J. P. Hoach, J. W. Moore, Frank McCaffery, G. W. Wells, Albert Munz, J. T. McClay, J. A. Buckley, W. H. Hobbs, Z. Tallafiero and R. L. James. P. W. Myers is attorney for Crenshaw. Redmond people regard the suit as a joke.

A TREASURED RECIPE.

The newly elected city treasurer has furnished The Bulletin with the following recipe for date pudding: "Mix in suitable bowl, two breakfast cups of bread crumbs, one cup of flour, one and one-half of sweet chopped apples, two of dates chopped roughly and one-half cup of sugar. Add liberal pinch of salt and two teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Moisten with two eggs beaten in a little milk. Put into well buttered bowl, cook by steaming from three to six hours. Serve hot with cream or other sweet sauce."
