

# CHOOSE BOARD OF ENGINEERS

FIRST MEETING TO BE NEXT MONTH

Character of Dam for Tumalo Reservoir Will Be Considered—Adams Given Extension of Time to January 1—Other Project Items.

LAILAW, Dec. 22.—At the last meeting of the Desert Land Board, it was decided to hold a consulting engineer's meeting some time the early part of January, presumably between January 10 and 20, to consider the character of dam to be constructed. The personnel of this board will be D. C. Henney, consulting engineer, Portland; C. M. Redfield, chief engineer of the Central Oregon Irrigation Co.; John H. Lewis, state engineer and secretary of the Desert Land Board, and O. Laurgaard, engineer of the Tumalo project.

The J. J. Adams contract at camp 4 for the excavation of approximately 13,000 cubic yards of material expired on December 1st, but work has just been received from the Desert Land Board that on the recommendation of the Project Engineer one additional month has been granted for the completion of this work. During the past week a marked improvement has been noted in Mr. Adams' method of handling the contract, and if he keeps up the present gait, he should

complete the contract by the end of the year.

The J. J. Adams contract at camp 5 under the direction of Mr. Ross, foreman, is being pushed hard, and if the work continues as it has the past week or ten days, indications are that Mr. Adams will make some money on this contract.

Camps 1 and 2 have been abandoned and the work of hanging the steel flume and the completion of the Adams' contracts will be done from camps 3 and 4. Camp 4 is still running to take care of the crew on the drill investigations at the dam site. The hauling of hay and other preparations are now being made for an early start in the spring on the construction of the dam.

The contract was let Wednesday for a carload of explosives to the Trojan Powder Co., for \$2389.84, for immediate delivery.

From recent expressions of various settlers and from letters received from non-resident water users, it would appear that practically all are willing to sign up the new contract as soon as it is received from the printers.

The construction of camp 5 is practically completed. From this camp Bull Creek dam and drop No. 2 into the reservoir and all roads around the reservoir will be constructed. Camp 7, which will be located somewhere near the A. F. Will place, will be constructed in the near future. From this camp the main canal from the reservoir on the distribution system will be constructed.

At the close of business for the month of November the project records showed that to date 26,424 meals at a cost of \$8836.83, or 24-2-6 cents per meal, had been served at the project camps, showing a profit of about 1/2 cent per meal served, which is considered a very good record when the character of the food that has been supplied is considered.
