TEACHERS AVERAGE LOW.

(Prineville Journal.)

County school superintendent Myers, in making out a record of the qualifications of the teachers of Crook county for their work, found that he had 19 teachers that were only eighth grade graduates. Twenty-nine teachers had no qualifications aside from some high school training. There were 12 high school graduates who have no special training. The county superintendent reports 52 teachers who have had normal training, but only 8 of these are normal graduates. Not one of whom is from the state normal at Monmouth. Thirty-seven teachers of the county have had some college training, but only 16 of these are college graduates.
