

FAVORS COMMUNITY WELL

Governor Thinks Farmers Should Be Given Financial Aid To Drill.

To relieve dry farm homesteaders in Central Oregon of the necessity of hauling water 10 or 12 miles to their homes, Governor West has recommended to President A. H. Averill of the Portland Chamber of Commerce that financial assistance be given in drilling community wells.

"The situation could be relieved through the drilling of community wells from which the entire neighborhood could draw its water supply and thus remove the necessity of traveling an unreasonable distance for water."

"If arrangements could be made to finance such an undertaking this office would be pleased to provide for the establishment and operation of one or two outfits through the use of convict labor. This plan would reduce the cost to a minimum and it being a work in the public interest the coming Legislature should appropriate funds to reimburse any organization that might see fit to aid in financing the undertaking."

NEW ACCOUNTING SYSTEM.

A new uniform system of book-keeping for all state and county offices has been inaugurated in Oregon. The last Legislature created a new law providing for the system of accounting and the state insurance commissioner was empowered to prepare ledgers, blanks, forms, etc., for its use, having until January 1 to complete this work and get the system started over the state.

MARKET REPORT.

NORTH PORTLAND, Jan. 17.—Receipts for the week have been, cattle 1758, calves 11, hogs 6742, sheep, 8195. That cattle prices did not break badly and cause a panic this week is the remarkable feature to the trade. Following the depression a week ago, Monday came forth with a veritable deluge of cattle and buyers prevented disaster by cleaning up the supply and relieving the congestion. Beef outlet, however, has been narrow ever since, and a very poor demand rules. Killers got some good hay-fed steers at prices ranging from \$7.00 to \$7.40 and cows \$6.00 to \$6.50. Hog trade was steady to firm during the entire period. Monday's run broke all records, the total being 2950 head. Receipts during the other four days added approximately 4000 more. Packers seemed to welcome this big run as it contained many cars of firm, smooth stuff, for which the bid \$8.00 and \$8.10, with the bulk price at \$8.00. The market closed a shade weaker with the best top hogs going at 8 cents. Mutton and lamb markets have maintained former price levels easily, especially for the choice grain-fed varieties. Prime wethers sold at \$5.75 and ewes at \$4.50, but medium quality was cut sharply. Fancy lambs were not offering freely, the best ones selling from \$6.00 to \$6.25 early in the week. Strictly choice grain lambs are quoted \$6.50 to \$6.75 at the close of business. Sheep house liquidation large.
