More game birds, 24 in all, arrived In town on the Priday express and were liberated Saturday morning on a hill west of town. The shipment came direct from the state game farm at Corvailis and consisted of 12 China pheasants and 12 Hungarian partridges, there being 6 males and 6 females of each variety. This is the second shipment of some birds into this territory in the past few months, 24 China pheasants having arrived in the latter part of These were kept for the winter on ranches in the surrounding country and are to be turned out as soon as weather conditions become settled. On account of the condition in which last week's shipment was in on arrival it was thought best to put them out at once. Efforts are being made to obtain a shipment for the Powell Butte constru

the Powell Butte country.

These birds are protected by state law and in addition the county court has offered a reward for detection of any violators of the state law. It is hoped that everyone in the country will keep from molesting them so that they will have an opportunity to increase and furnish sport in the future. According to the game authorities the birds will be established in three years, if not bothered in the meantime.
