#### IMITATION PEARLS.

They Are Made With Essence d'Orlent, a Fish Scale Product.

As the real pearl comes from the oysfer, so to a large extent is the manu facture of artificial pearls dependent on a certain species of fish. The complete processes of manufacture are, of course, trude secrets, but it is interest-Ing to know that it is from the briltient scales of the ablet, or bluy, that essence d'orient is produced, as with this essence imitation pearls are made.

The blay is a small fish with a green back and a white betty, and the essence is obtained exclusively from its white scales, which are covered with a pigment of metallic appearance. They are first treated with amounds and then with fish gine, a powder being first obtained and then a paste which can be easily spread on gines

In the early stages of pearl manufacture, about 1656, this ecoence d'orient was applied to little balls of plaster, but the temperature and the damp beat of the bumun body modified the adhesive qualities of the pearly matter and eansed changes of votor. In 1080 a Parisian named Jacquin invented a method of covering small glass balls with this essence, thereby producing the first practical artificial peart.

In the north and east of France and in Germany blay fishing is actively pursued. About 4,000 are required to produce a pound of senies, which in turn gives a quarter of a pound of essence. New York Press.

Window gines exposed to the bent and cold and varying winds will, after a number of years, become so brittle that it can be cut with a pair of shears. It is said that light and darkness have different effects on glass. and this alternation alone will cause it to become fragile and in time worth-

It is almost impossible to remove old windows from a building without breaking many of the panes of glass. New glass can be handled with much more carelessness.

There is a certain elasticity to new giass that leaves glass which has faced the weather for a number of years. Street fakers who travel throughout the country selling scissors will obtain a lot of old window glass and show the crowds how wonderfully their shears will cut by clipping off strips of the glass just as a person would cut paper, when in fact the feat is due to the fact that the glass is actually rotten.-Harper's Weekly.
