

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Regular May term of County Court convened at 10 o'clock a. m. this sixth day of May, 1914, at the court house, at Prineville, Crook County, Oregon.

Present G. Springer, Judge; R. H. Bayley and Willis W. Brown, Commissioners; Warren Brown, County Clerk; Frank Elkins, Sheriff.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the Baldwin Sheep Company, County road.

Petition presented to the Court, all papers certified to as to form by the District Attorney. Bond approved in the sum of (\$250) two hundred and fifty dollars. Viewers ordered to meet on May 18th, 1914 and view out the proposed road, and report thereon at next regular meeting.

Resolution: Whereas the Court realizes the necessity of opening a good and sufficient road from Ashwood to Madras; and that this road should be opened as soon as possible and work begun thereon; It is hereby resolved that the Court express its willingness to appropriate the sum of Two Thousand (\$2000) Dollars as soon as the preliminary report and survey have been filed in this Court and approved thereby.

In the matter of road district No. 24, Hat Rock, and district No. 25, Allen Willcox appointed supervisor for Hat Rock District No. 25 and Powell Butte District No. 25 for the year 1914.

In the matter of Alfred Wild, et al County road.

Petition and affidavit of posting notices presented together with certificate of approval by the District Attorney. Bond approved in the sum of \$200.

Ordered that the viewers meet and view out the said road on June 15, 1914.

Upon the request of the petitioners Wm. Farrell, authorized to act as supervisor of the construction and do the work on said road, when the preliminary report and survey have been approved by this court.

In the matter of work on County roads.

On petition in person, Andrew Morrow authorized to expend the sum of \$150 on certain roads in the Willow Creek and Lamocuta road districts.

In the matter of the creation of the Bend Justice District.

Petition presented by the citizens of Bend asking that the justice districts of North and South Bend be abolished and a district created co-extensive with the boundaries of the City of Bend, and to be designated as the Bend District.

Order granting petition (see order). J. A. Eastes and Lon L. Fox appointed Justice of the Peace and Constable, respectively, for said district.

In the matter of a license to sell intoxicating liquors.

Petition presented, signed by legal voters of Ireland Precinct No. 47, asking that a license be granted to G. W. Raper to sell intoxicating liquors on certain premises in the City of La Pine, in the La Pine Hotel. Filed, proof of a majority of legal voters. Affidavits to the number of rooms and no-conviction of selling to minors. Affidavit as to publication. Receipts from County Treasurer for \$200. Bond approved in the sum of \$1000, with National Surety Company as sureties.

Order granting license for six months, beginning May 1st, 1914. (See order.)

In the matter of striking certain property from the tax rolls.

Petition of L. Seeburger asking to have the taxes on certain property rebated for the year 1913, and to have said property stricken from the tax rolls as the title to the same is in the United States. Filed certificate from Desert Land Board of State of Oregon.

Order: Rebate granted in the sum of \$25.10 and striking said lands from the tax rolls of the county. (See order.)

In the matter of taxes for the year 1908 on lot 6, block 9, City of Bend, Oregon.

Stipulations filed by District Attorney and by N. G. Wallace, attorney for owners of said lot. Ordered that the Sheriff be instructed to receive taxes on said lot on a valuation of \$850; and that the lien against this property for personal taxes of the Central Oregon Banking Company for the year 1908 be discharged.

In the matter of correcting tax payment.

Petition presented by J. H. O'Neill showing payment on wrong property. Matter continued.

In the matter of Tax rebate.

Petition of — Moffett for rebate of taxes on lots in Opal City. Petition denied. Tender of \$150 in satisfaction of all taxes refused.

In the matter of double assessment.

On the petition in person of L. H. Hamilton, W. E. Wills, and S. L. Wills and a certificate of double assessment by the Sheriff. Ordered that a rebate be allowed in the sum of \$5.50 and that the Clerk be instructed to draw a warrant in favor of the said L. H. Hamilton for that sum.

In the matter of the Ashwood road district, No. 11.

Floyd C. Klits appointed road supervisor for Ashwood District No. 11.

In the matter of the Willhoit and other bridges.

Claims presented by the Coast Bridge Company for work and material. Bills certified to by District Attorney. Ordered that the bills be allowed in the following amounts and that the Clerk be instructed to draw warrants accordingly in favor of the Coast Bridge Company.

Willhoit bridge, contract April 23, 1914, \$2350; Willhoit bridge, on account, \$2000; Deep Canyon trestle, on account \$3000; Antelope Canyon bridge, contract December 8, 1913, \$1701.60; Tumalo bridge, contract

April 27, 1913, \$660. Total \$9711.60. May 7th. Court convened at 9 o'clock a. m. Same officers present as yesterday.

In the matter of White Butte precinct.

Mrs. Annie Senecal appointed Justice of the Peace for White Butte Precinct, No. 19.

In the matter of H. B. Ford, et al, County Road. Change in.

Resolution adopted recommending the change described therein in the H. B. Ford, et al, county road, as a public necessity and directing the county surveyor to survey and report on the same.

County Surveyor filed report, survey giving complete field notes and map of change.

Ordered that the first day of July, 1914, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. at the County Court room be set as the date of hearing said report of County Surveyor.

In re support of indigent poor.

Report presented by H. C. Ellis containing itemized statement of receipts and disbursements, together with all vouchers. Report examined, approved and ordered filed.

In re dictionary.

County Superintendent authorized to purchase an International Dictionary for his office in the court house.

Oregon-Washington Railway and Navigation Company.

County Clerk requested to furnish the Oregon-Washington Railway and Navigation Company with a certified copy of the report of Supervisor Monroe on work done on county road between Gateway Station and Agency Plains.

In the matter of the proposed Newsum Creek county road.

Resolutions adopted recommending the establishment of the Newsum Creek proposed county road as described therein as a road of public necessity and directing the County Surveyor to survey and report on the same. Filed. Surveyors report containing preliminary report and map.

Order setting July 1st, 1914, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. as time for hearing on said report of County Surveyor. District Attorney to prepare proper notices.

In the matter of the Joseph Street, et al, proposed county road.

Petition presented accompanied by affidavit of posting notice. Certificate of approval by District Attorney. Bond approved in the sum of \$200.

Viewers ordered out to view and survey said proposed road on June 23, 1914.

W. H. Munnell, et al, proposed county road.

Petition presented accompanied by affidavit of posting notice and certificate of approval by District Attorney. Bond approved in the sum of \$100.

Viewers ordered out to view and survey said road on June 20, 1914.

J. A. Morris, county road.

Supplementary stipulations filed by the petitioners and remonstrators by their respective attorneys, H. C. Ellis and T. E. J. Duffy. (See stipulations.)

Viewers ordered out under stipulations to view out and survey said road on June 22, 1914.

L. C. Young, et al, proposed county road.

Petition presented accompanied by affidavit of posting notice and certificate of approval of District Attorney. Bond approved in the sum of \$200. Viewers ordered out on June 15, 1914.

In the matter of county roads.

E. T. Luthy county road, viewers report read for first time.

W. P. Gift county road, viewers report read for first time.

E. J. Hooch county road, viewers report read for first time.

D. H. Toeman county road, viewers report read for first time.

T. A. Graham county road, viewers report read for first time.

W. C. Buckner county road, viewers report read for first time.

C. B. Swalley county road, viewers report read for first time.

H. M. Austin county road, viewers report read for first time.

Chas. Austin county road, viewers report read for first time.

In the matter of wrongful assessment.

On petition of Serepta Hamilton in person showing that she had been assessed on Government land, rebate allowed in the sum of \$8.50. Clerk instructed to make an order and draw warrant in her favor accordingly.

In the matter of a widow's pension for Hattie Kamstra.

Application for widow's pension, showing three children under the age of sixteen presented by Hattie Kamstra. Investigators report filed. All papers approved by County Judge.

Order pension in favor of said Hattie Kamstra in the sum of \$20 per month.

In the matter of the vacation of a portion of Gateway.

Plat presented and all the provisions by law having been complied with, order approving said vacation signed in open court. See order on plat.

In the matter of remitting tax penalty.

On petition, penalty remitted in favor of G. M. Cornett in the sum of \$28.37. Clerk instructed to make proper order and draw warrant accordingly.

In the matter of Henry Montgomery road supervisor.

Report of May 4, 1914, continued. In the matter of tax rebate.

Petition of J. E. Retzlaff for a tax rebate denied.

In the matter of cancellation of taxes.

Petition of Frank E. Newberry for a cancellation of 1908 taxes. Representation of T. B. Kay showing certificate for taxes for 1908 on said de-

scribed property. Action of Sheriff in cancelling taxes for 1908 approved.

Cancellation of county warrants.

In the matter of Justice of the Peace for Imperial District.

On petition, Warren McConnell appointed Justice of the Peace for Imperial District.

In the matter of wrongful assessment.

Petition of Sherman Montgomery for rebate of taxes on town lots in Imperial. Denied.

Petition of C. F. Smith for rebate on delinquent taxes. Denied.

Resolution adopted declaring the proposed Sherman Montgomery county road as described therein a public necessity and ordering County Surveyor to make a report thereon. (Petition presented requesting action by County on road.)

Report filed by County Surveyor. In the matter of the Sherman Montgomery county road, continued.

Ordered that July 1st at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. be set as the time of hearing said report. District attorney instructed to prepare the
