Ordered that the County Clerk advertise for bids on four foot wood, pine or juniper, eighty cords for the Crook county high school and one hundred cords for the County court house; wood to be delivered on or before September 30th, 1914. Bids to be submitted on or before July 1st, 1914.

In the matter of wrongful assessment.

On petition of W. M. Wilson, ordered that he be granted a rebate on taxes paid in the sum of \$303.45. Clerk to draw warrant in favor of said W. M. Wilson for said sum. (See order.)

In the matter of county bridges.

Court desires to make note of the fact that total cost of hauling the Antelope Canyon bridge is \$256.45; for unloading bridge No. 2, or the Willhoit bridge, and hauling the same, \$318.70.

Clerk instructed to issue proper order opening a part of the proposed road as a public highway according to the viewer's report as modified by the Judge's report.

The County Court resolved to go on record as willing to open the remainder of the said road according to the viewer's report another year.

In the matter of the appropriation for the Bear Creek and Paulina county roads.

Petition of the Prineville Commercial Club in writing asking for an appropriation of \$15000.00 to be made out of the General Road Fund in warrants and showing the advisability of completing the Paulina and Bear Creek roads this season.

Ordered that an appropriation of Fifteen Thousand (\$15000) dollars be made out of the general road fund under certain conditions as in the written order specified. (See order.)

Approved by Commissioners Bayley and Brown. Judge Springer signifying a willingness to sign the order with the following proviso: That the order shall be in force only so long as the road budget and ten per cent additional is not exceeded.
