

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

A special session of the County Court convened at the Courthouse in Prineville, Oregon, at 3 o'clock p. m., Wednesday, June 3, 1914. When present: G. Springer, Judge, presiding; R. H. Bayley, Commissioner; W. W. Brown, Commissioner; Frank Elkins, Sheriff and Warren Brown, County Clerk.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Ordered that a widow's pension of \$10 per month be allowed Mrs. M. R. Reed.

Ordered that a warrant in the sum of \$117.62 be issued in favor of Geo. H. Brewster, for bill presented at March term and disallowed then, because of failure to itemize same.

Ordered that a warrant on the road fund in the sum of \$250 be issued to W. M. Ferrell, and also a warrant for \$250.00 be issued to W. E. Claypool; said money to be used to complete work already begun in their respective districts.

In the matter of the McKenzie road; Whereas Crook County is pledged to co-operate with the Forest Service in the improvement of the McKenzie road, and the people of Bend, Redmond, Sisters and Prineville are guaranteeing to carry the indebtedness until May, 1915, in case it is required to protect the county's finances, it is ordered that work may continue on same. (See order.)

The request for money for road improvement in the vicinity of Redmond and Bend presented; Judge objects on ground that if the money is expended it will exceed the budget for general improvement.

Request of the Commercial Club of Redmond for \$250 for the Potato Show for 1914, presented by Mr. Rodman.
