

SHEEPMEN HAVE GOOD SEASON

WOOL PRICES ARE EXCELLENT

With Estimated Average Price of 17 Cents and Increased Production, \$3,400,000 Comes to Oregon in First Year of No Tariff.

Of the 20,000,000 pounds of wool produced in Oregon this season fully 14,500,000 pounds have been sold, making the fastest selling movement ever known in the history of the local industry. Not only was the selling movement quicker, but the prices obtained for fleece one of the best known here. While definite figures are still lacking because of some of the late sales not yet averaged, it is likely that the average price this season in this state will run close to 17 cents a pound—and some interests are inclined to believe that a fractional advance will be shown above this.

Not only did Oregon wool growers receive more money per pound for their fleece this season, but instead of showing a decrease in supplies—as was indicated by the wool trade throughout the world, there is an actual increase of about 2,000,000 lbs. in the clip over recent years. Such a showing was wholly unexpected by both the trade and producers.

Taking the generally accepted average for this year's price, the wool clip of Oregon this season will bring \$3,400,000 to the producers compared with \$2,000,000 a year ago. Last year's wool clip was sold under very adverse circumstances—mill buyers were very hesitant in their views regarding the taking off of the tariff and producers were quite willing to accept their views. This year with free trade, the highest prices in years have been received and not only this, but the clip is much greater says H. H. Cohn, in the Oregon Journal.

WENANDY GETS MAIL CONTRACT

COMPANY'S BID IS ACCEPTED

Service Begins July 1—Auto Trucks to be Used and Trip to Silver Lake Made in Ten Hours—Have Much Freight to Bring From South

The Wenandy Livery Company has been awarded the contract for carrying the mails to La Pine, Fort Rock and Silver Lake and return for four years from July 1. Bids for this service have been received by the Post Office Department at three separate times this spring, but on the two earlier times were not accepted on account of various difficulties. In anticipation of this work the Wenandy Company has recently bought three Mack auto trucks, of two ton capacity each, and these will be used exclusively on the postal route. Drivers for these trucks have already been engaged; John Lichtenstern of Sisters, Leo Leach and Louis Seeley of Bend, L. D. Fox will have charge of the business for the company.

Although the postal schedule calls for a running time of 28 hours between Bend and Silver Lake it is expected that with the trucks 18 hours will be ordinarily cut from this and the trip made in 10 hours. With the leeway afforded the company expects no difficulty in coming well within the schedule times for all but a few weeks in the winter when it may be necessary to use teams.

J. H. Wenandy made a trip to Silver Lake last week to complete arrangements for the service, there. Among other things he contracted to bring in to Bend some 70,000 pounds of wool which will be freighted in to Silver Lake. The trucks will bring this in as opportunity offers.

In addition to the mail carrying business the trucks will carry passengers, express and baggage, and the office of the company is now being enlarged to provide a waiting room and space for the storage of merchandise.
