

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

County Court of the State of Oregon, For The County of Crook, September Term, 1914.

(Continued from last week.)

K. A. Nelson road: Petition together with other required instruments presented by K. A. Nelson et al. for the establishment of a county road. Submitted to District Attorney. Petition denied for lack of jurisdiction because the description of said proposed road is indefinite.

J. M. Kief county road: Petition with other required papers presented by J. M. Kief, et al. for the establishment of a described county road. Submitted to District Attorney. Petition denied for lack of jurisdiction, petition and notice not in form required by law.

F. W. McCaffery road: Petition with other required papers presented by F. W. McCaffery, et al. Approved by District Attorney. Petition granted. Viewers ordered out September 21, 1914.

In the matter of tax rebates. Petition of J. B. Bell with affidavit asking for tax rebate on East Half of Section 36 in Township 20 South, Range 16 E. W. M., on an erroneous assessment. Order rebate of penalty for the year 1910 in the sum of \$45.00 to J. A. Bell.

In the matter of the Opal City Warehouse. Bond in the sum of \$1000 submitted by Opal City Warehouse, M. Van Tassel, proprietor. Clerk instructed to request said company to furnish a proper application for warehouse license. Continued.

In the matter of road work in Township 16, Range 14, E. W. M.

On petition of residents of Powell Butte for aid on certain county roads. Order that when the said petitioners in Township 16, Range 14, E. W. M., shall have worked eleven days with teams on said roads under the direction of A. D. Morrill, hereby appointed special supervisor of this work, then this county agrees to furnish not more than \$250.00 as aid on said road to be paid out on the presentation of bills and vouchers properly approved by A. D. Morrill.

In the matter of scalp bounty. Report of Warren Brown, county clerk on payment of bounties from June 20th to September 1st, 1914. Approved and accepted.

In the matter of the school industrial exhibit.

Order a warrant in the sum of \$265.00 to be drawn in favor of Superintendent J. E. Myers to be used in granting awards and in conducting the school industrial exhibit at the Crook County Fair this month.

In the matter of Balfour, Guthrie Company.

The clerk is instructed to notify the Balfour Guthrie Company (Interior Warehouse Company) that a license as required by law will be issued to them as warehousemen at Madras and Culver on the return to this court of proper applications and properly executed bonds in the sum of \$2000.000 for each warehouse. Order clerk to grant said license on presentation of proper bonds as approved by District Attorney.

In the matter of H. C. Topping and Company.

Whereas no bond as ordered by this court is now on file by the H. C. Topping and Company as warehousemen the District Attorney is hereby ordered to begin legal action against said company providing the required bond is not filed on or before the 15th day of September, 1914.

In the matter of care of blind. Order a warrant drawn in favor of J. E. Myers, Superintendent, in the sum of \$50.00 to be used in sending Ellen Faston to the State Institute for the blind.

Court convened at two o'clock p. m. Present G. Springer, Judge, presiding, and other officers same as in morning.

In the matter of filing county bills. Order. The clerk is instructed to place no bills on the claim docket after this date which are not filed with said clerk on or before the Tuesday preceding the regular term of court at which the said bills are to be acted upon.

In the matter of pauper burials. The county court gives notice that hereafter it will not pay a sum to exceed \$25.00 for the burial of any pauper. This amount to cover all expenses connected with said burial. The clerk is instructed to notify the Coroner to this effect.

In the matter of wrongful assessment. The claim of Nellie H. Allen for wrongful assessment on SW 1/4 of Section 31, Township 11, Range 16 E. W. M., for 1914. Continued for explanation.

In the matter of rebate of penalty on second half payments. Order. The County Treasurer instructed to return to all tax payers the penalties collected on the second half of the 1913 assessment roll, and to rebate the same to all persons paying on same in the future. (See order.)

Court adjourned at three o'clock p. m., to meet in regular adjourned session at four o'clock p. m., September fourth, 1914.

Regular adjourned session of county court of Crook county, Oregon, convened this fourth day of September, 1914, at the hour of four o'clock p. m., at the court house, Prineville, Oregon.

Present: G. Springer, Judge, presiding, R. H. Bayley, Commissioner, Willis W. Brown, Commissioner, Warren Brown, Clerk, Frank Elkina, Sheriff. Commissioners waive formal notice of this session.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had to-wit: In the matter of the formation of Jefferson county.

On the presentation of petitions properly verified according to law, the court orders that the question of the formation of Jefferson county within the boundaries of the present Crook county be submitted to the voters at the next general election. (See order.)

In the matter of the formation of Deschutes county. On the presentation of petitions properly verified according to law, the court orders that the question of the formation of Deschutes county within the present boundaries of Crook county be submitted to the voters at the next general election. (See order.)

Petition presented by about 60 residents in or near Imperial remonstrating against the formation of Deschutes county.

In the matter of widow's pension. Order widow's pension to Mrs. Viola Tetherow in the sum of \$10 per month beginning September 1st.

In the matter of claim of G. W. Updike. Order warrant in the sum of \$20 drawn in favor of G. W. Updike for work done by Carl Updike on the Deep Canyon Trail.

In the matter of the Post bridge. Order warrant drawn in favor of

1914. In the matter of the San Francisco fair.

All Fair Associations in the county are requested to contribute the best of their exhibits not of a perishable nature to a Crook county exhibit at the San Francisco Fair in 1915. Clerk is instructed to send out written requests to secretaries of Associations.

Court convened at 8:30 o'clock this 5th day of September, 1914. Same officers present as yesterday.

In the matter of the N. G. Hullin claim for damages. Oral petition of N. G. Hullin for damages on J. G. Edwards road. Denied.

In the matter of an indemnity for tuberculosis cattle. On presentation of affidavit of veterinary ordering the slaughter of certain tuberculous cattle by George Kissler claiming indemnity in the sum of \$25.00 and by Matt Kulosek claiming indemnity in the sum of \$100. Order setting November 4th, 1914, at hour of 10 o'clock a. m., as date of hearing of said claims.

In the matter of the vacation of certain county roads in the City of Bend. Order. When deeds granting certain highways to public use in the City of Bend have been approved by the District Attorney and the Crook County Abstract Company, the county agrees to vacate certain county roads now existing within the corporate limits of Bend. (See order.)

In the matter of the Bend Road District. On the report of accountant John T. Wheeler showing a just debt due the Bend Road District No. 3, in the sum of \$661.06. Clerk instructed to draw warrant in favor of the Bend Road District No. 3, in that sum.

In the matter of the Bend School District No. 12. Petition of School District No. 12 asking for a refund of certain moneys paid by it to the county treasury. Received. Ordered continued and referred to the District Attorney. District Attorney directed to secure the services of John T. Wheeler, accountant to check said petition and to determine the correct amount if any due said district.

In the matter of tax rebate. On the representation of the Franciscan Capuchin Order that lot 15, block 19 in the City of Prineville, is held by it for religious purposes; ordered that the taxes on the same in the sum of \$13.25 be rebated for the year 1914. Clerk instructed to issue proper order.

In the matter of the amended map of Prineville Acres. The amended map of Prineville Acres presented by the Oregon and Western Colonization, approved by court and dedication accepted by signing plat in open court. (See plat.)

In the matter of claim of G. W. Updike. Order warrant in the sum of \$20 drawn in favor of G. W. Updike for work done by Carl Updike on the Deep Canyon Trail.

In the matter of the Post bridge. Order warrant drawn in favor of

E. D. Achey in the sum of \$700.00 (Seven Hundred Dollars) for work on Post bridge.

Court convened at eight o'clock this 8th day of September, 1914. Present, G. Springer, Judge, presiding, Willis Brown, Commissioner, Warren Brown, Clerk, Frank Elkina, Sheriff.

In the matter of Road District No. 24. Order a warrant in the sum of \$7 drawn in favor of H. Gee for special road work done in Broese District No. 24.

In the matter of voting precinct No. 46. Resignation of Sherman Montgomery, as Judge of the Election Board in Imperial District No. 46 accepted. E. E. Varco of Brothers, Oregon, appointed in his place as a member of the election board at Imperial.

In the matter of Justice of the Peace for Redmond Precinct. W. C. Walker former Justice of the Peace for Redmond precinct having moved permanently out of the county, the court hereby appoints J. H. Dittmore as Justice of the Peace for Redmond Precinct. Bond of J. H. Dittmore as Justice of the Peace approved by court.

On motion, Court adjourned.
