

BEND WINS IN A WALKOVER

FOOTBALL SCORE IS 30 TO 0 SATURDAY

Redmond Eleven Goose Egged By All-Around Superiority of Local Eleven Saturday—Scoring Starts Early—No Goals Were Kicked

Playing brilliant football the Bend High School team walloped the Redmond eleven on their own grounds to the tune of 30 to zero Saturday afternoon. The local boys played all around their opponents in every department of the game, showing lots of pep and the results of good coaching plus natural ability.

"Every player was a star," says Coach Erskine.

While that is quite true, it is also accurate to say that in offensive work Steidl, Brandenburg, Kelley and Thompson distinguished themselves, while Van Matre and Hunnel, tackles, shown on the defense.

The first touch-down came three minutes after the game started, as a result of only four plays, two of them forward passes and two quarter back runs. Brandenburg's interference for Kelley was a feature. Each of the two named scored two touch-downs. No goals were kicked. Steve Steidl referred, Durand was umpire and Bob Roberts chief linesman.
