

ROBERT E. STRAHORN WILL ARRIVE TONIGHT

PRESIDENT OF PORTLAND, EUGENE & EASTERN RAILWAY VISITS
CENTRAL OREGON IN HIS PRIVATE CAR ON A TOUR OF
INSPECTION—WAS BUILDER OF AYER CUT-OFF.

To-night's Oregon-Washington train will bring the private car of Robert E. Strahorn, president of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Company. No special reason for Mr. Strahorn's visit is given, other than a visit to become acquainted with Central Oregon.

Mr. Strahorn was the inspiration and builder of the North Coast road in Washington, which was recently opened to traffic by the O.-W., and is known as the Ayer Cut-off. The P. E. & E. operates 194 miles of inter-urban rails in the Willamette valley, and is electrifying a large portion of the Southern Pacific's Oregon system.

Closely identified with Northwestern railroad development for many years, Mr. Strahorn's history is perhaps the most picturesque of any of the big men of the modern west who have built large successes upon small beginnings. On this trip he probably will be accompanied by his wife, who is the author of several books of travel.
