money if they club together. If you buy by the 100 pounds, they wist cost you at least \$3.75. If you will club with the other farmers of the county in buying and can order by the ton or the carload, they will cont

only about 3 cents per pound.
"I am trying to help the farmers to save money. If you expect to plant field peas in the apring will you orwith the others! If so, please fill in space below and return to me.

"On dry land plant 75 pounds per acres; on irrigated land, 100 to 120 pounds. Where summer fallow has been plowed in the fall, peas may be grown on summer fallow.
