

CURING PORK ON THE FARM

(By County Agriculturalist A. E. Lovett.)

I have been asked by many farmers for recipes for curing pork at home. Many recipes have been given for the curing of pork but I believe three of the best are given by Prof. Patterson of the Kansas Agricultural College.

PLAIN SALT PORK. Rub each piece of meat with fine, common salt and pack closely in a barrel, let stand over night. The next day weigh out ten pounds of salt, two ounces of salt-petre to each 100 pounds of meat, dissolve in four gallons boiling water. When this brine is cold pour over the meat; cover and weight down. This should be kept in the brine until it is used.

RUGAR CURED HAMS AND BACON. Rub each piece of meat with salt and allow to drain over night, then pack closely in a barrel, hams and shoulders in the bottom, using the strips of bacon to fill in on top. To each 100 pounds of meat weigh out eight pounds of salt, two pounds

of brown sugar and two ounces of salt-petre, dissolve in four gallons of water and cover the meat with this brine. For summer use it is best to boil the brine, allowing the brine to become thoroughly cooled before using. For winter curing it is not necessary to boil the brine. The bacon strips should remain in the brine from four to six weeks and the hams six to eight weeks.

DRY CURED PORK. To each 100 pounds of meat weigh out five pounds of salt, two pounds of sugar and two ounces of salt-petre, mix them thoroughly. Rub each piece once a day for three days with one-third of the mixture.

The sugar cured hams and bacon recipe is the most satisfactory under ordinary farm conditions and when cured by this method will keep right through the summer after they are smoked. The meat will be sweet and palatable and the flavor good if properly smoked.

MARKET REPORT.

NORTH PORTLAND, Dec. 25.—Receipts for the week have been: Cattle 632, calves 9, hogs 7122, sheep 2469. The cattle market opened up for the week very actively. Good quality of offerings was in evidence, choice steers going as high as \$7.75, cows touched the \$6.60 level. Since Monday the run has been below normal with good demand. A very keen hog market started Monday with a run of nearly 6,000, tops bringing \$7.50. This market has maintained its supremacy in price over all other American markets for some time. With the exception of Monday's run the receipts of sheep continue light. The market on all classes of sheep is good and killers take all offerings readily. Shipping to the market could be materially increased without any decline in price.
