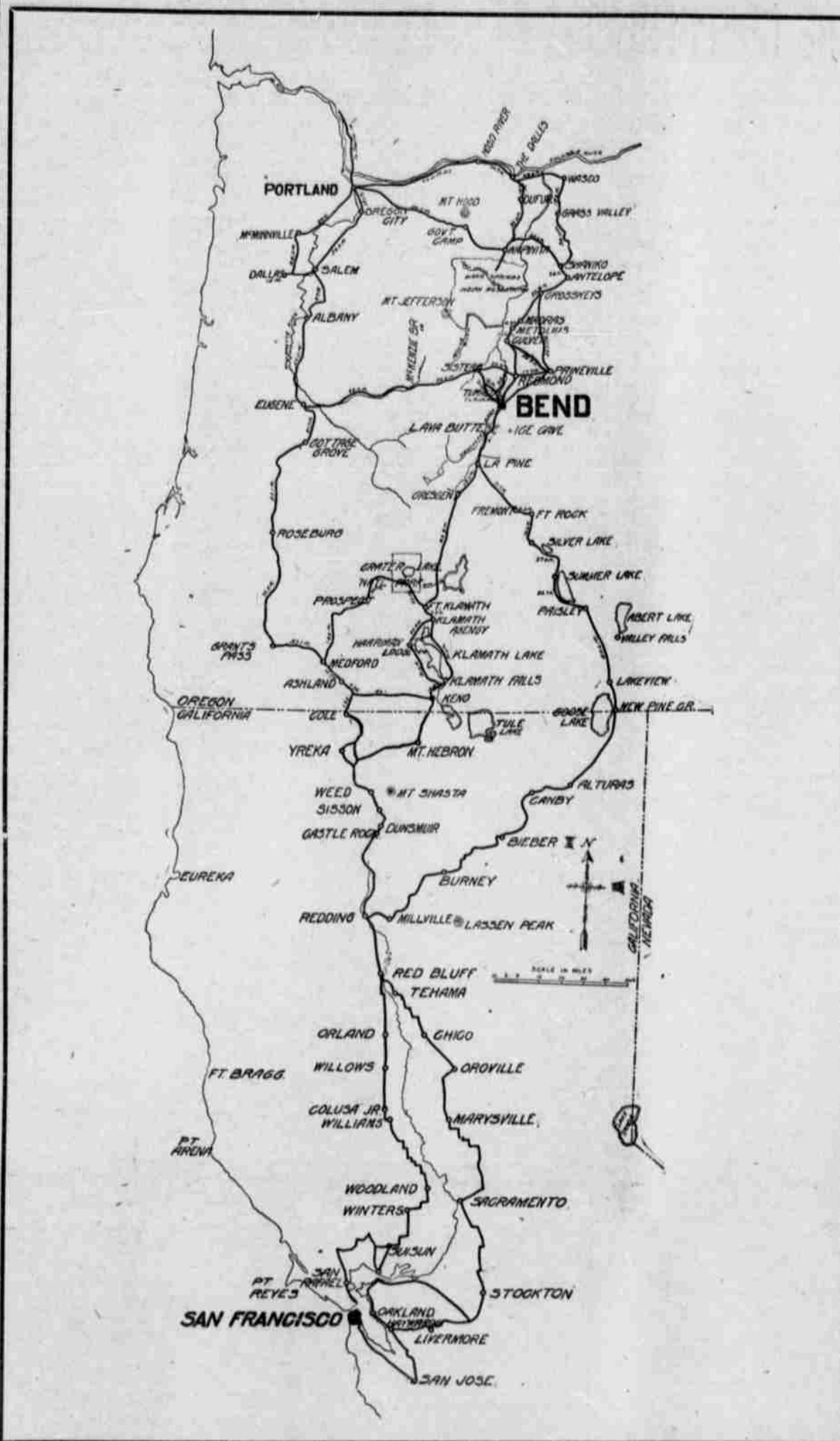

Cut This Out and Send it to Your Friend Who is Planning an Auto Trip to the San Francisco Fair



In two former issues of The Bulletin an auto road map has been printed showing the routes north and south through the Willamette and Deschutes valleys with the connecting links by way of the McKenzie pass, Government Camp and the Crater lake road.

The above map is an extension of the one showing only Oregon roads, carrying them down into California as far as San Francisco. In the preparation of the map confusing detail has been omitted but certain points of interest such as Lava Butte, Crater lake, Lassen peak and the ice cave are shown for the benefit of the tourist.

Anticipating a heavy auto travel through Bend this summer nearly all the business men of the town have had this map printed on the back of their letter heads. Dozens of them will go out in the mail every day and will undoubtedly help in bringing travel this way.
