Commercial Club Report

MANAGER H. H. DE ARMOND OF THE BEND COMMERCIAL CLUB HAS RENDERED THE FOLLOWING REPORT OF THE CLUB WORK FOR THE PAST TWO MONTHS.

Manager's Report for March and April, 1915.
To the Directors of Bend Commercial Club, Gentlemen:—

The following is a report of the Club for the months of March and April, 1915.

Financial.

Balance, cash on hand March 1st, 1915	\$348.84
Receipts for March, 1915, dues	85.00
Receipts for April, 1915 dues	73.00
Total	\$506.84

Disbursements.

Cash paid out during March, 1915	\$108.60
Cash paid out during April, 1915	59.71
Total Disbursements	\$168.31
Balance on hand May 1st, 1915	\$341.53

Dues have slightly fallen off during the months covered by this report, partly on account of not being able to reach all members and partly because of the inability of some to pay. In the disbursements above shown is one item of \$50.00 paid to the Portland Automobile Club for space in their auto guide booklet which makes the disbursements seem rather heavy for the period. The club is in good condition financially as shown by the balance on hand.

Membership.
The membership still remains close to one hundred although several of this number have fallen in arrears in their dues. Most of them intend to pay up as soon as possible, however. Considering the general condition of affairs financially in the community the club is strong from the standpoint of membership, most of those belonging being active.

Activities.
The most important work accomplished by the club during this period is the improvement and build-

ing of the road toward Powell Butte. Several miles of good road have been built, mostly by donations of the business men of Bend and the farmers in the vicinity of the road. This improvement will be of great benefit to the community as it makes the marketing of the products of that section much easier.

A strong committee has been appointed to look after the matter of irrigation. This committee will make an effort to induce Congress to make an appropriation for irrigation when it next convenes.

Also Miss Helen M. Manny has been selected to represent this community at the celebration at the opening of the Cello Canal at Big Eddy on May 5th, the club paying the expenses.

A large number of letters of inquiry have been received during this period from all over the country all of which have been answered and literature of Bend and Central Oregon sent to most of them. As a result of this correspondence several people have come here to live.

The Saturday luncheons continue to be well attended which shows the interest taken by the members.

A committee appointed by the club has been working in conjunction with the Parent-Teacher Association to provide playgrounds for the children. The play grounds are now an accomplished fact. The Parent-Teacher Association is mainly responsible for this, however.

The club is now in a position financially to improve and furnish suitable club rooms for the accommodation of strangers and farmers coming in to town as well as for the members. Furniture should be put in with plenty of reading matter and other necessary things that would make the room attractive. This should be done now in order that we might be ready for increased population that is coming to Bend as a result of the development that seems assured.

MARKET REPORT.

NORTH PORTLAND, April 29.—The receipts for the week have been: Cattle 1267, calves 24, hogs 2570, sheep 3395. Where the offerings in the cattle division were heavy the opening of this week the demand was also heavy. Cattle clung to the high price spot throughout the week. Choice steers are quoted at \$7.50 to \$7.75, cows \$6.25 to \$6.65. Monday opened up with another gain in the swine division prices going from \$7.85, last week's top, to \$8.05, making an advance of 20c all told. Demand excellent for choice light hogs. Sheep market holding firm. Spring lambs are selling at \$8.75 to \$9, ewes \$5.50 to \$5.75, yearlings \$6.75 to \$7. Packers are still short of supplies.

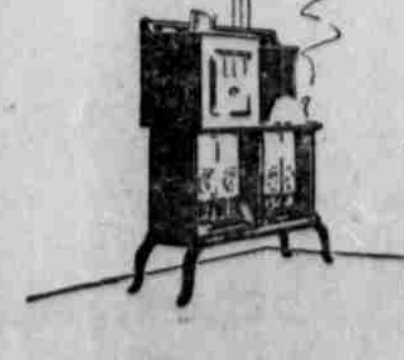
