

# MUSTARD HOUSE IS DESTROYED

## NEW RESIDENCE WAS BURNED SATURDAY

Family Had Moved in Only Few Days Before—No One at Home When Blaze Was Discovered—Loss Is Partly Covered by Insurance.

The newly completed home of Glen W. Mustard, in Deschutes addition, was totally destroyed by fire Saturday forenoon. A considerable portion of the furniture and most of the doors and windows from the house were saved.

The fire was discovered by children who were playing in the adjoining yard around Ralph Spencer's house and at that time had broken through the roof near the chimney. It apparently started from a defective flue and had been smouldering for some time since there was no fire in the kitchen stove when the blaze was discovered. Mr. and Mrs. Mustard were both at Dr. Coe's office at the time, with two of their children who were to have slight operations.

Word of the fire was telephoned to town from the Knotts hospital and many autos hurried out to it. Both hose wagons were taken but the distance to the nearest hydrant was so great that it was impossible to get water to the house and all efforts were confined to saving its contents. At one time it seemed probable that the Spencer home would be endangered by fire running through the pine trees, between the burning house and it, but a fortunate shift of the wind turned the flames away.

Mr. Mustard is one of the proprietors of the Bend Blacksmith Shop, having opened the shop on moving here from Powell Butte last fall. It is understood that his loss is partly covered by insurance. The house was new, having been completed and the family moved in only a few days ago.

## FOREST SERVICE PLANS AN INNOVATION IN OCHOCO TRACT

Will Place Patrolmen on Road to Keep It in Shape for Traffic During the Coming Summer.

PORTLAND, May 10.—An innovation which the Forest Service has planned for this summer is the placing of a patrolman on the recently completed Prineville-Mitchell road in the Ochoco Forest in Central Oregon. This idea is copied from a foreign country, and is known as "maintenance patrol."

The patrolmen will drag the road periodically, keep ruts filled, ditches open, weeds out, brush down, and look after such work as will keep the road open and smooth for traffic. In fact, his duties will be similar to those of a section man on a railroad. It is certain that the close attention of one man will keep the road in such good shape that there will be an economic saving that will more than justify the expense.

The Mitchell-Prineville road forms the connecting link between Prineville and the John Day watershed in northwestern Oregon. The 13 miles which was built by the Forest Service extends across the National Forest from the Ochoco Ranger Station to the Beaver Ranger Station. In building this road, the Service located it 200 feet lower than the old route, and also reduced the maximum grade from 29 to 9 per cent. The work cost the Government approximately \$10,000, of which sum Crook and Wheeler counties each contributed \$1,200. The traffic on the road is heavy, for it furnishes an outlet for the fruit country in the John Day Valley, and enables the people of that region to reach Prineville, Bend and Crooked river valley.

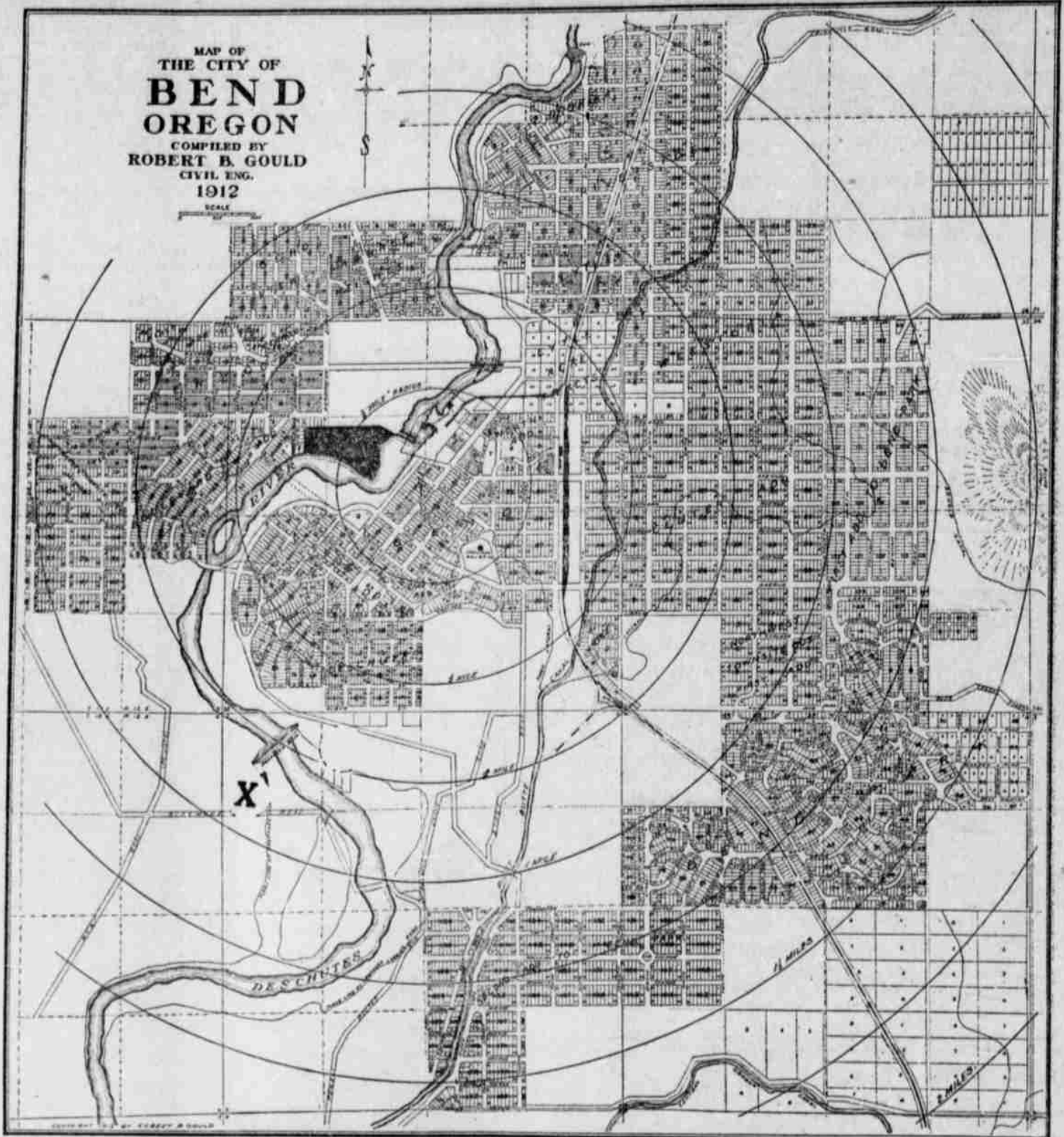
