PLAINVIEW.

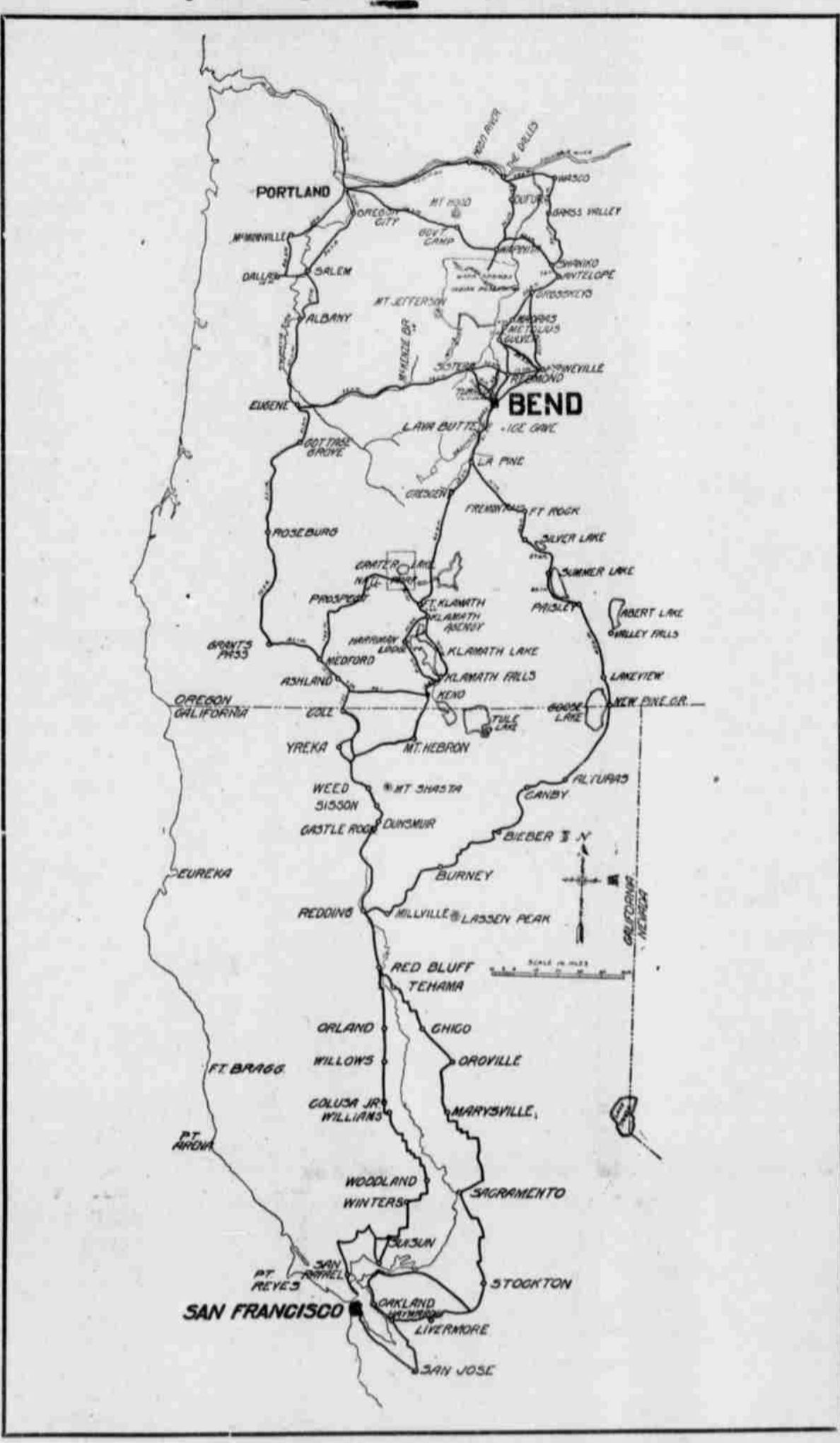
