NORTH PORTLAND, June 29.—
The receipts for Monday are: Cattle 1103, calves 17, hogs 3460, sheep 1887. Monday's receipts were fairly heavy though nothing startling in the way of quality was in evidence. Some fairly good steers sold at \$7.25 although the bulk went at \$6.75 to \$7; cows \$6 to \$6.25 and heifers \$6 to \$6.50. Market considered steady. More hogs came forward beginning of week than for some time. Everything considered market was strong. Bulk brought \$7.70 to \$7.75, tops at \$7.80. No change in the sheep market, only a handful being in evidence to begin the week's trade. Market steady.

ADDISON BENNETT SAYS LOVETT ASSET TO COUNTY

Newspaper Man Writes of Crook County Agriculturist in Concluding Article on Prof. Shaw's Trip.
In the last of Addison Bennett's articles on the recent trip of Professor Thomas Shaw and other railroad officials through the Central Oregon country, published in the Oregonian on Sunday, appears the following appreciation of County Agriculturist Lovett:

"In my former article I mentioned the other members of the party, Messrs. Graham, Arney, Hardy and Freeman, representing the railroads, and Professor Lovett, the County Agriculturist of Crook County. Let me say a few words more about the latter gentleman. He is a young man, but he has had quite a good many years' experience as an agricultural teacher. This is his first year in Crook, but he is surely doing a grand work. He has much to learn about the soil and climate of the section, but he is learning about the people, for it is a difficult matter for a stranger to go into a territory as large as the State of Massachusetts (as Crook was before Jefferson county was cut off) and embrace all portions of the county and get a good understanding of the people of the various communities. This, however, must be done to a degree before a teacher can succeed as every conscientious teacher wishes to before much can be accomplished.

"But Professor Lovett is one in a thousand, and if his services will not be worth to the people of Crook a hundred times his salary, then I am no judge. Never did I see a more conscientious worker than Professor Lovett; never did I see a man to whom the people warmed up as the people of Crook do to this young teacher. He resides at Redmond, where he has a wife and one child, and his home life is as happy as his public life is useful."

THE JUNE WEATHER

Rise in Temperatures Noted—Month Has Twenty Four Clear Days.

During the month of June, as was to be expected, the days became steadily warmer, until, on the last day of the month the mercury reached the high mark of 91 degrees. With the increasing heat there was a noticeable absence of precipitation, only .6 inches falling and this all in one day, the 24th.

The mean maximum temperature for the month was 75.9 degrees, the mean minimum 37.4 degrees and the mean 65.7 degrees. There were no cloudy days in June, only six partly cloudy and 24 clear.
