

COUNTY COURT NOTES

At the July term of court the sum of \$180 was appropriated to pay Dr. Rosenberg's expenses in removing Mrs. Prisco from Crook county. Mrs. Prisco has been a county charge since her husband left her some months ago. The court has now decided to have her deported to Italy. At present she is confined in the county jail. The court has ordered that the O. C. Cardwell county road be opened as soon as funds are available. Allen Wilcox is ordered to supervise the expenditure of not over \$500 on the Redmond-Powell Butte road. County Clerk Warren Brown paid out over \$2,000 in bounties in the months of May and June. A widow's pension has been granted to Hattie Morris. County Treasurer Jordan has been ordered to keep his office in the court house open and \$33.33 per month has been allowed him for deputy hire. County Commissioner Blanchard was appointed by the court to investigate the matter of an appropriation for the Central Oregon Fair Association. The tax collector has been ordered to sell all lands bid in by the county on account of delinquent taxes. The suit against ex-County Commissioner Bayley for an accounting is to be pressed more vigorously. Commissioner Blanchard has been appointed to secure legal assistance for District Attorney Wirtz in the prosecution of the suit.

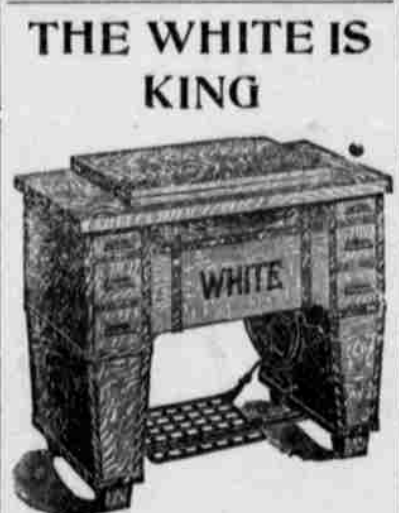
