COUNCIL PAYS BILLS

Ordinance Passed Ratifying Transfer of Half Interest in Mill Spur.

The chief business to be transacted at the August council meeting last night was the passage of an ordinance ratifying the transfer by the Oregon Trunk to the Deschutes company, a subsidiary of the O-W. R. & N. Co., of an undivided half interest in the recently granted franchise for the spur line to the Shelvin-Hiscox mill, and the payment of bills.

For convenience all transactions to date in connection with the building of the spur have been in the name of the Oregon trunk. Both companies, however, are jointly interested, and now that the line and bridges are practically completed the transfer is being made.
