## THE AUGUST WEATHER

## TWO TESTS FOR ANY CIGARETTE

The taste of the cigarette—according to a leading tobacco journal—is up to the smoker. But there are other qualities that you should look for in the cigarette that you are going to stick to your tongue. Here are a couple of tests that may help the average smoker to choose more wisely between different kinds of cigarettes.

The first test is for coolness, which means more comfort to the throat and tongue. Light say cigarettes. Draw in a cloud of smoke—a small, ordinary cloud of smoke—into your mouth. Let it sit in your mouth for a few seconds. If it "feels" against the smoke, it is not sufficient to make the throat and throat. Now blow out the smoke. If the cigarette leaves a large grade of mild tobacco leaves, combined in just the right proportion, it will always feel COOL and smooth, both to your throat and to your tongue.

On the other hand, if the proportions are not right and if the cigarette contains

interior grades of tobacco or hidden strands of rank, old leaf, you will feel a stinging sting at the tip of your tongue or that "sawdust" tickle in your throat.

Test number two
