
McCann to Open Shop.

MARKET REPORT.
NORTH PORTLAND, Sept. 27.
 Today's cattle receipts continue fairly heavy. This month's receipts have gone ahead of September receipts for last year over 1000 head. Twelve hundred head were unloaded Monday. The market shows only fairly active, quality is not as good as it has been and cattle are going at a

\$6.75 top for steers, cows and heifers are relatively lower. Receipts were 1200. Considering everything the market may be said to be steady to lower. About 300 hogs went through the gates this morning. The market seemed easier, top offerings going at about 16 cents lower. The sheep market is showing strong, lambs are selling at seven cents, ewes five-fifty. Nearly 6000 head were unloaded over Sunday.

 Work was begun yesterday on the construction of a party wall between the Dement grocery property and the store occupied by the American Bakery on Wall street. A brick wall 20 feet in height is to be erected, Jack Tausay doing the work.
