THE OCTOBER WEATHER

In the month just passed clear days continued to be in the majority, there having been 16, as against 14 partly cloudy and one cloudy. In this respect the month compared favorably with October, 1914, and it was warmer than a year ago, having a mean temperature of 50,8 degrees against 48,5 last year. The present as against 48.5 last year. The mean maximum was 723 degrees and the

maximum was 73.3 degrees and the mean minimum 28.2.

The highest point reached by the mercury was 82 degrees on the 2nd. and the lowest 19 on the 12th and the 14th. The greatest daily range was 61 degrees. In precipitation the month was lacking, rain falling on one day only with a total of .03 inches. A year ago 1/29 inches fell in October.
