Local Former Football Stars Start Practice for Turkey Day Battle in Bend—Many Turn Out.

In a football season where the best laid plans of coaches and dopsters have been upset from the Atlantic to the Pacific oceans, and in a season where the sporting columns have been crowded with gleanings from the gridiron camps all over the country, the "has-beens" of the pigskin game are beginning to itch for a scrap.

It appears that former football men in Bend have been touched by the bee, and steps were taken late last week for the organization of a town football team. The matter of the organization of a town team was suggested to Bend followers of football two weeks ago by coach Lawson of the Crook County High school. Upon their return to Bend several former football men began a survey of the town and assembled the names of a sufficient number to make up two teams.

A light signal practice was held last Sunday afternoon and on the belief that a team can be organized, a challenge has been issued to Prineville through Mr. Lawson to meet the Bend team here on Thanksgiving Day. It is expected to hold late afternoon and evening practices during the week with the high school eleven to get in condition for the game.

A formidable lineup has been selected and assurances were given by the men that they would indulge in the necessary training to prepare for the struggle.

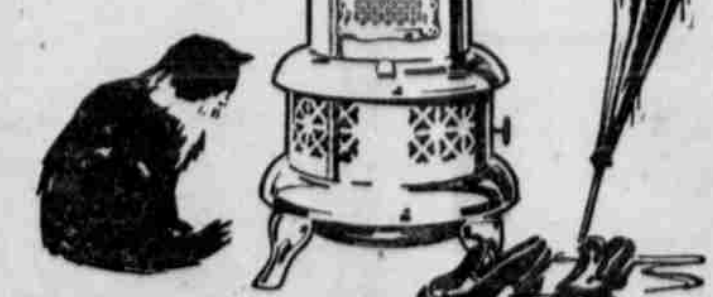
