THE BROOKS-SCANLON AND THE SHEVLIN-HIXON SAW MILLS.

This picture, taken from the roof of the planer shed of the Shevlin-Hixon plant, shows portions of the Brooks-Scanlon and the Shevlin-Hixon plants as follows: at the extreme left, Shevlin-Hixon office building, next it, logging pond dam and bridge, above dam, Brooks-Scanlon saw mill (under construction), back of mill, clearing for lumber yard, in front, Deschutes river with log booms in place, Upper right hand corner, Shevlin-Hixon saw mill, running from mill toward center of picture, sorting shed, at left and off end of sorting shed, power house (unfinished), foreground, 20 dry kilns, (under construction). To right of office and below dam may be seen engine on logging road.

**HAS COMMISSION AUTHORITY?**

Public Service Body Will Settle C. O. I. Company Question Soon.

(Oregon Journal.)  
HALEM, Nov. 12.—The question of whether the state public service commission has jurisdiction over irrigation companies will be decided before long. The commission has practically completed arrangements for proceedings that will definitely settle the matter. Some time ago water users of the Central Oregon Irrigation Company's project complained to the commission that the company was not giving adequate service and that it was not keeping its canals in shape to provide for future needs. Attorney General Brown gave the commission a verbal opinion that it had jurisdiction and steps are now being taken to assert authority.

The matter came up at a meeting of the State Desert Land Board yesterday afternoon when a Central Oregon Irrigation project reorganization scheme, broached by Engineer O. Laurgaard, who looked after the construction of the Tumalo project for the state, came up. Kay said no one had asked Laurgaard to propose the plan and he thought the Desert Land Board should not take any notice of it until either the water users or the company suggested it. It was decid-

ed to take no action on the Laurgaard plan.

**CAR STORAGE IMPORTANT**

Precautions Suggested for Motorists Who are Careful.

Winter is coming! What are you going to do with your car?  
Every motorist should know that unless he pays particular attention to the way he stores his car or the manner in which he uses it during the winter months, he will incur a large repair expense bill.
