Farmers' Meetings are Popular Community Organizations Growing in Favor Among Farmers. By County Agriculturist A. E. Lovett

The value of community organizations to the farmer is proven by such organizations within Crook county. Where these community organizations have continued active, there is no inclination whatsoever to abandon the organization. The work to be undertaken by community organizations may be any work which will improve the community and its people in any way. The item of most interest to practically all the farmers of Crook county at present seems to be directed toward the extermination of the jack rabbit as a farm crop pest, and in my opinion, only through such organizations and active work on the part of the individual and these organizations can the pest be in any way diminished. I have, during the past week, received many calls for meetings and shall be kept busy for some time to come visiting such meetings and assisting in the organization of the communities. Individuals or communities wishing to hold a meeting or to see their community organized should write early and name dates most favorable to them. It will pay to make a first and second choice as to dates inasmuch as requests are coming in regularly. There are four things which I hope to assist in actively throughout the coming winter in this county. They are: Community organizations, a county organization, destruction of the rabbit as a pest, and better roads. Any assistance that the citizens of the county can give me along these lines will be greatly appreciated, and any assistance that I may be able to give will be gladly given. I consider a community organization the first and most necessary work for obtaining results in the other lines mentioned.

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
