igation district bonds are unsealable. Be It Resolved, That we recommend the appointment of a campaign committee of 3 to educate the bonding public...

Whereas, The modern plan for irrigation development is the District Plan, and

Whereas, The funds for financing such irrigation development must be secured from the public money market which is very dubious of the securities of the irrigation district and

Whereas, It appears that the United States Government has offered dollar for dollar with the state in irrigation construction.

Now, Be It Resolved, By the Central Oregon Irrigation Congress assembled in Redmond, Oregon, this December 11, 1915, that we heartily recommend for the favorable consideration of the Oregon Irrigation Congress the proposition of submitting to the people of the state a constitutional amendment...

Whereas, The district irrigation plan is not well understood by the people within the proposed districts, and

Whereas, Many erroneous ideas are held in regard to the effect of district organization,

Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Irrigation Congress be urged to prepare pamphlets setting forth the advantages of the irrigation district plan and explaining the laws governing it, with especial reference to the distinction between irrigation under the district plan and under the Carey Act.

Whereas, The irrigation questions of Central and Eastern Oregon are matters not thoroughly understood in other portions of the state, and

Whereas, This lack of understanding has a tendency to defeat measures for the benefit of said Central and Eastern Oregon,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Oregon Irrigation Congress at its next session be urged to form a publicity bureau for the dissemination of information concerning irrigation in the section east of the Cascade mountains to the end that measures for the benefit of the irrigated sections of the state may be favorably received throughout the state.

Whereas, The Carey Act for the irrigation of the public lands of the United States has proved a failure in its operation and there is no further possibility of reclamation under its provisions, and

Whereas, The district plan for the reclamation of arid lands is rapidly gaining favor, being now conceded to be the best plan of securing irrigation and

Whereas, Irrigation districts are self dependent and in their first years liable to meet with difficulties until the settlers upon them get upon their feet, and

Whereas, Aid for irrigation projects in the early years is of double value and if obtained from the United States can be had on the most favorable terms,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That this meeting heartily endorse the principle embodied in the Jones bill, Senate 4627, now pending in the U. S. Congress and urges the Oregon representatives in Congress to use their best efforts to obtain the passage of the act.

And Be It Further Resolved, That this meeting recommend to the Oregon Irrigation Congress, the appointment of a committee to be sent to Washington, D. C., to work for the passage of the said Jones bill.

Whereas, It is conceded that the whole Central Oregon district is vitally interested in irrigation and to attain results along these lines it is clear to all that the district plan is at present the most feasible, and

Whereas, Owing to the condition of the money market in relation to irrigation projects in general, it would seem desirable that in order to advance the stability of irrigation bonds the state should guarantee interest on such bonds.

Therefore, Be It Resolved, That this meeting urge upon every citizen of Central Oregon to aid in bringing about this result and that we especially urge that everyone who possibly can attend the irrigation Congress at Portland with this idea in view and that a campaign committee of one member from each section be appointed to work for the largest possible attendance at the coming convention and

Furthermore, Be It Resolved, That each organization entitled to representation at the Oregon Irrigation Congress, from Crook and Jefferson counties, select one member of its representatives as an organization committee to outline a plan of procedure at said Congress and that all delegates from this section get together at said Congress.
