

# COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Be it remembered that a regular term of the County Court of Crook County, Oregon, was begun and held at the Court House in Prineville, Oregon, on Wednesday, the first day of March, 1916, the same being the first Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a regular term of said court, when were present at the hour of ten o'clock in the morning, the following officers: G. Springer, Judge, presiding; H. J. Blanchard, Commissioner; H. J. Overturn, Commissioner; Warren Brown, Clerk; E. B. Knox, Sheriff. Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Redmond-Prineville road, Warrant ordered in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in favor of John Tuck for the completion of the Redmond-Prineville road.

West Side Agricultural Fair Association. Report of West Side Agricultural Fair Association on appropriation of \$200 made to them by Crook County in 1915, approved and ordered filed. Order an appropriation in the sum of \$200 made to said association for fair to be held in fall of 1916. Clerk instructed to issue warrant in said sum on request on or after September 1st, 1916.

Sisters Fair Association. Order an appropriation in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to the Sisters Fair Association when said Association submits a proper report of the expenditure of the appropriation made by this Court to it in 1915, and when said report has been approved by the Court.

County roads: Chas. A. Sherman road. Final survey and report of surveyor continued until first day of May term, 1916.

O. F. Wallenberg road. Final survey and report of surveyor continued until first day of May term.

Extension of G. F. Elliott road. Hearing held on the preliminary report of the Surveyor; proper notice to property holders appearing; no objections; Surveyor ordered to make final survey and report on first day of May term.

Tumalo project No. 1 road. Preliminary hearing continued until first day of May term.

Barnes Butte road. Resolution adopted recommending the establishment of the Barnes Butte road as a public highway and directing the Surveyor to make a preliminary report or survey forthwith.

Frank Ogles road. Resolution adopted recommending the establishment of the Frank Ogles road as a public highway, and directing the Surveyor to make a preliminary report or survey forthwith.

C. H. Dealy road. Hearing held on the preliminary report of the Surveyor; proper notice to all property owners appearing; the Court having considered all objections made before it to the said road. Order Surveyor to make final survey and report at the first day of May term.

C. W. Roberts change in Winzer road. Hearing held on the preliminary report of the Surveyor; proper notice to all property owners appearing; no objections; order Surveyor to make final survey and report on the first day of May term.

Recording Gage in Squaw Creek. H. G. Kennard, as water master, instructed to purchase and install a recording gage in Squaw Creek at site of present government gage.

Farmer's Telephone Association. On petition filed, franchise granted to the Farmer's Telephone Association over highways of Crook county.

Adjournment for day. Court convened at nine o'clock this second day of March, 1916. All officers present.

County roads. Barnes Butte road and Frank Ogles Road. Preliminary reports of Surveyor filed; order setting Wednesday, the third day of May as time of hearing on said reports and directing that proper notice thereof be given to all property owners concerned.

S. V. Hardin No. 2 road. Hearing on preliminary report as continued held; proper notice to all property owners appearing; claims for damages as made by J. O. Powell and S. V. Hardin at June term of court considered; preliminary report approved; except as to damages herein allowed; Surveyor instructed to make final survey and report; Damages allowed as follows: to S. V. Hardin, all material necessary to build new fences required on line of road through or adjacent to his place, said material to be similar to that in the fence on line of said road now on the S. V. Hardin place. County agrees to place woven wire fence along the lines of the road through and adjacent to the lands of A. Zell and J. O. Powell. A. Zell hereby gives notice in open court of an appeal, asking for damages for land belonging to him to be taken for said road.

M. Mayfield. On proof of lost warrant, order warrant No. 1357, Class 27, cancelled in sum of \$3.10; and a warrant in like amount issued to M. Mayfield.

Charles Sipschen. Petition requesting the repayment of \$4 as Fire Patrol fees erroneously paid referred to State Forester, inasmuch as the full amount of all fees collected by this County for Fire Patrol has been remitted to the State Forester.

F. S. Dunn. Order warrant No. 436, Class A in the sum of \$33.10 issued to F. S. Dunn cancelled, as erroneous, and a warrant issued to the said F. S. Dunn in the sum of \$2.50.

Thomas M. Anderson Camp. Order warrant drawn in the sum of \$46.80 in favor of the Thomas M. Anderson Camp for the use of indigent soldiers of Crook county.

J. W. Livingston. Petition filed by

J. W. Livingston of Redmond, asking for indemnity in the sum of \$25 for one tubercular cow slaughtered under the 1913 law. Order setting Tuesday the Fourth day of April, 1916, as the time of hearing on said claim.

Unlawful assessment. All action on the claim of unlawful assessment of \$4, 25% of Section 24, Tp. 18, S. R. 12 E. W. M., and lots 3 and 4 of Section 19, Tp. 18, S. R. 18 E. W. M., for 1910 and 1911, deferred until original papers in matter, properly executed are filed with this court.

Petition of George C. Truesdale. Petition of George C. Truesdale asking to be appointed road supervisor of District No. 25 denied, no road supervisors being appointed this year under the present system of road work.

Redmond Bank of Commerce. On proper proof to the court showing payment of taxes on land on which no patent had been issued; order refund of said taxes in the sum of \$79 to D. H. Peoples as agent for Redmond Bank of Commerce.

County Agriculturist. Order an appropriation for the County Agriculturist in the sum of \$1500 for the year 1916. Order warrant drawn in favor of C. L. Hawley, secretary of Board of Regents of Oregon Agricultural College in the sum of \$750; and direct clerk to draw a warrant in like amount to said C. L. Hawley or his successor in office on the first day of July, 1916.

Logan McPherson. Order judgment of Crook County, Oregon vs. Logan McPherson in the sum of \$145 cancelled and satisfied on the receipt of \$23.

Crandall and Roberts. Bid of Crandall and Roberts, public accountants, found the lowest and accepted for audit of Crook County books. District Attorney instructed to draw contract.

Squaw Creek Irrigation District. Hearing held according to notice for formation of Squaw Creek Irrigation District. George Brewer appearing for the Squaw Creek Irrigation Company objected to the petition as irregular in form and as to the number of qualified signers. Geo. Brewer appearing for Hahn Friede on Sec. 16 in Tp. 15, S. R. 10 E. W. M. asked to have said land withdrawn from the district as not susceptible of irrigation from the proposed source.

Appearance made by the Shevlin-Hixon Lumber Company asking to have the 1/4 of Sec. 34, Tp. 15 S. R. 10 E. W. M. withdrawn as not susceptible of irrigation. All matters ordered continued for further consideration until Wednesday, the 15th day of March, 1916, at hour of 11 o'clock in the morning.

Oregon and Western Colonization Company. Order warrant drawn in favor of the Oregon and Western Colonization Company in the sum of \$50, when said company shall have filed with the clerk a deed and complete abstract to a certain parcel of land to be used by the county for cemetery purposes and adjoining the north side of the old cemetery at Prineville.

Redmond potato show. Report of expenditure of appropriation made in 1915 to the Redmond potato show approved. Order appropriation in favor of Redmond potato show in the sum of \$250; warrant to be issued on request on or after September 1st, 1916.

Adjournment for day. Court convened this third day of March, 1916 at hour of nine o'clock in the morning. All officers present.

S. V. Hardin No. 2 road. Final survey with field notes and report of surveyor filed; accepted and approved by Court. Order said road as therein described opened as a public highway.

Ralph L. Jordan. On proof of loss of warrant No. 947, Class 26, in amount of \$6 order warrant in like amount issued to Ralph L. Jordan.

Road work warrants. Order warrant drawn in favor of Commissioners Overturn and Blanchard, each in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to be used as a portion of the revolving fund on road work.

Dedication of plats. Dedication and plats of the Highland Addition to Bend and the addition to Bend approved by Court and ordered placed on record.

Court adjourned this third day of March, 1916, to meet in regular adjourned session on Wednesday the fifteenth day of March, 1916, at the hour of eleven in the morning.
