

FIVE SPEAKERS TO REPRESENT BEND SCHOOLS ARE CHOSEN

Margaret Shreder and Myrtle Pugsley are High School Winners—To Appear at Redmond May 20.

Speakers to represent the Bend schools in the declamation contests to be held in Redmond on May 20 were chosen from the grade schools and the high school at contests held on Wednesday and Monday evenings. In all five pupils will take part, three from the grades and two from the high school.

At the high school contest Monday evening there were five contestants, Margaret Shreder, with Josephine Preston Peabody's "The Piper," was given the decision on the dramatic side and Myrtle Pugsley, who spoke, "Mrs. Ruggles and the Dinner Party," was chosen on the humorous side. Of the other speakers, Floyd Reynolds giving "Sparticus to the Gladiators," received a large measure of appreciation from the audience.

With 15 contestants the work of the judges in the grade school speaking was a more difficult task and in no case was a unanimous decision rendered. The three winners were: Newton Schlappi with "Oh, I wish I was a Grown-up"; Allie Powell, with "Mummy's Little Pickaninny," and Evelyn Clark with "Settin' a Hen."
