

BEND TO HAVE SPEEDY NINE

TETHEROW MAY TWIRL FOR LOCALS

Organization Will be Effected and Plans Made for Schedule With Teams From Portland and Columbia River Basin this Season

Prospects are bright for Bend to have the fastest semi-pro base ball team in Central Oregon. This was shown last Sunday when, for the first time that it had been together, the Bend team made easy pickings of the fast Shevlin-Hixon Company's nine with Jess Tetherow, who twirled for Prineville last season in the box, winning over the mill team by a score of 8 to 0. Although the nine has not been organized indications are that Bend will be represented by a team which will give some of the city league teams of the state a fast run.

That Tetherow, who is considered to be one of the best semi-professional pitchers in Oregon, is anxious to play with Bend was indicated last Sunday after the game when it is said that he practically gave the team his word that he would twirl for Bend this season. Tetherow, supplemented by Norval Springer, will give Bend a strong pair in the box.

Will Organize Soon.

At a base ball meeting which will be held within the next few days more definite plans relative to organization and schedule of games for the coming season will be made. The Bend team expects to get into action earlier this season than last. It is expected that the schedule will include games with several city league teams of Portland, Hood River, The Dalles and other Columbia river towns, Prineville, Redmond, Burns, Paisley and Lakeview. Teams of other towns will be included just as soon as they are organized.

To Form City League.

A city league which will include the town team, the team from The Shevlin-Hixon Company and The Brooks-Scanlon Lumber Company will be arranged later on with a regular schedule of games.

The personnel of the team to date includes Monte O'Donnell, catcher; Tetherow and Springer, pitchers; Steidl, first base; Horton, second base; Roy Davis, third base; Miller and Reed, short stop; Springer and Johnson, right field; Sprout, left field and Stover, center field. Other men about town are being counted for early enlistment.

In last Sunday's game Tetherow gave the Bend fans something like a base ball treat. He allowed one hit; got 26 strike outs; only two men got on bases, and those not until the seventh inning; 11 of the first 12 men were struck out; no men were walked; in the first seven innings only the pitcher, catcher and first baseman touched the ball. Tetherow got three hits, of which one was a banger which he tried to stretch into a home run and got caught at the home plate.
