

BOARD SELECTS F. THORDASON

WILL HEAD SCHOOLS
NEXT YEAR

Lebanon Man Has Wide Range in
Teaching Experience and Comes to
Bend Highly Recommended—
Successor to H. L. Hopkins.

Franklin Thordason, for the last three years superintendent of the Lebanon, Oregon, public schools, was elected on Saturday by the board of education to the superintendency of the Bend public schools for the coming year to succeed H. L. Hopkins, who goes next year to Enumclaw, Washington. Mr. Thordason's election was based largely upon his personal visit last Saturday, when he met with the board, and the high character of the recommendations which were sent in advance of the meeting.

The new superintendent has had 16 years of teaching experience, having taught two terms in rural schools, one year principal of grade schools, one year principal of the high school and 12 years city superintendent of schools, five years with the state normal at Mayville, North Dakota, as principal of the Practice School and instructor of the summer school. Mr. Thordason is a graduate of Gustavus College and the University of South Dakota and took special work at the University of California.

The letters of recommendation accompanying Mr. Thordason's application show him to be a man of high moral character, wide experience in the educational field and that he has been successful in the work in which he has been engaged.
