

FIELD DAY WILL BE BIG AFFAIR

REDMOND TO BE HOST TO SCHOOLS

Bend High School Will Have Full Representation in All Events Special Rates are Offered—Better Accommodations Prepared

The Fifth Annual Field Day of the Crook county schools at Redmond on Saturday, May 20, promises to be one of the best that has ever been held in Crook county. A keen interest is being shown among the schools of Bend, Prineville and Redmond in all the events that are scheduled to be held.

Bend will be represented in every event on the day's program. Although it is not expected that Bend will carry off the track and field honors, it is believed that the local school will make a more favorable showing than it did last year.
