

# CHAUTAUQUA RUNS ONTO SNAG

## LOCAL GUARANTORS UP IN ARMS

Believe Action of Company in Arranging Event for Prineville Is Breach of Contract That Bend Be Exclusive Chautauqua Town

When J. H. Hurd, manager of the Edison-White Chautauqua Bureau, came to Bend last January and arranged for a Chautauqua at Prineville, in violation of the agreement that would have made the Chautauqua for two years, made by representatives of the bureau last year, he told the fundation for a controversy which would likely to mar the success of the event this year as well as to prejudice many against the company Mr. Hurd represents.

The difficulty came to a head last night, when M. E. Paget, an advance agent for the Chautauqua, met a company of the local guarantors to discuss arrangements for this year's program. About 25 were present in the Commercial Club room to meet Mr. Paget, who came in on last evening's train.

In the beginning everything seemed to be going ahead without any hitch. Mr. Paget had described this year's program and a motion had been made for the appointment of a committee to take charge. Then, to the surprise of the present day war terms, a submarine boy in sight and ordered Mr. Paget to disembark some of the requirements of the company as to the local ticket sales or receive a torpedo square in the middle of the contract.

In the discussion that followed it was brought out that the local guarantors believe that Mr. Hurd's action last winter broke the Chautauqua contract so that they are no longer bound to it. Under what terms they would resume the obligation was not definitely brought out, the matter being left with a committee to determine in conference with the Edison-White Co.
