

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Court convened in regular adjourned session this sixth day of June, 1916, pursuant to its order of adjournment of May fifth, 1916, when were present at the hour of nine o'clock in the morning, the following officers:

G. Springer, judge, presiding; J. F. Blanchard, commissioner; H. J. Overturf, Commissioner; Warren Brown, Clerk; E. B. Knox, Sheriff.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of county roads. Preliminary hearing on the Barnes Butte and The Dalles-California Highway roads continued until Wednesday, the fifth day of July, 1916, service not being complete.

Hearing on the final survey on the C. H. Dealy and the Tumalo project No. 1 roads continued until Wednesday, the fifth day of July, 1916.

Final survey and report filed by surveyor on the Frank Ogles road, read and approved by Court; road ordered opened as a public highway.

Resolutions adopted recommending the establishment of Change No. 1 in the Hugh Lister road and recommending the legalization of the W. H. Carlin road and directing the surveyor to make preliminary surveys and report forthwith. Preliminary reports on said proposed road filed. Order setting Wednesday the fifth day of July, 1916, as time of hearing on report on Change No. 1 in the Hugh Lister road and setting Thursday, the sixth day of July, 1916 as the time of hearing on the W. H. Carlin road, and directing that pre per notice thereof be given to property owners.

In the matter of county physician. Order appointing J. H. Rosenberz, M. D., as county physician and health officer for a period of two years beginning July 1st, 1916, at a flat salary of fifty dollars per month for the performance of all the duties of county physician and health officer, including surgical operations and mileage. Commissioner Blanchard voting "No."

In the matter of claim for indemnity. Claim presented by F. T. Cox for indemnity for one Holstein bull slaughtered under 1913 law regarding tubercular cattle. Order setting Wednesday, the fifth day of July, 1916, as time of hearing on said claim.

In the matter of the improvement of telephone connections in Crook county. District attorney instructed to withdraw complaint made by this court against certain telephone companies operating in Crook county and filed with the Public Service Commission.

In the matter of contract of leasing a portion of the Deschutes river to John E. Ryan, trustee. Order transferring contract of lease from county to John E. Ryan to The Shevlin-Hixon Company, approving bond of said company and releasing bond of John E. Ryan and sureties.

In the matter of lease to Crook county. Lease from George P. Elliott and Bertha Elliott to county of certain premises for purposes of removing cluders, gravel, etc., consideration \$100, executed and placed on record.

Order warrant in the sum of \$65 drawn in favor of G. W. Foster for board of county indigents.

Order warrant in the sum of \$132.20 drawn in favor of W. H. Barney for lumber for county roads.

Order warrant in the sum of \$6.32 drawn in favor of M. E. Coleman for rebate on taxes for year 1915, on proof of wrongful assessment.

Order warrant in the sum of \$2500 drawn in favor of H. J. Overturf for following road work: Change south grade of Sisters road, McKinney cut off, Bend-Prineville, Paulina Lake road and Pringle Falls road.

Order warrant in the sum of \$223.25 drawn in favor of W. J. Buckley for work on county roads near Redmond.

Order warrant in the sum of \$2500 drawn in favor of J. F. Blanchard for work on county roads. Court adjourned for term.

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START ON MORSON PROJECT. (Silver Lake Leader.)

The Leader has received reliable information that work on the Morson Irrigation project of 28,000 acres, which surrounds La Pine, will commence about the first of next month. There is only about six weeks' work to finish the main canals on the west side unit. The time to complete all of the project has been extended for five years. The Morson company has machinery on the ground which was pronounced by former Assistant State Engineer R. C. Wygant, in September, 1911, after a week's examination of the project, to be "the best irrigation equipment owned by a private corporation in the entire Pacific Northwest."

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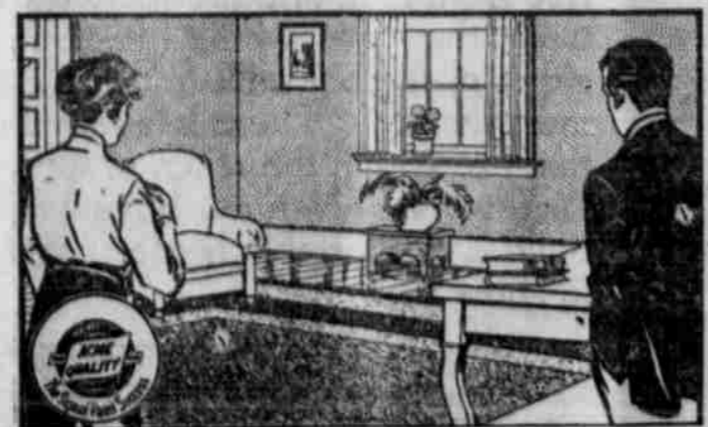
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
