

LAND IS GIVEN BY PAISLEY MAN

DONATES 11 ACRES TO RAILROAD

Makes Gift in Spite of Fact That Proposed Line Cuts His Ranch into Three Parts—Eleven Acres Included in Deed for Land.

Last Tuesday afternoon L. A. Moss and Mrs. Moss walked into the Paisley National Bank and placed their signatures upon a deed conveying to Robert E. Strahorn for use of the Oregon, California & Eastern railway, eleven acres of their ranch situated just east of Paisley.

This tract of land represents a strip of land 250 feet in width nearly across the Moss ranch and since the ranch is in the shape of an "L" and the right of way crosses both ends, it cuts the place into three tracts. The eleven acres comprises nearly all of the terminal grounds asked for at Paisley.

It is thus seen that the right of way hits Mr. Moss harder than any other person along the line and perhaps as hard as all the rest in this district put together.

When congratulated upon his generosity, Mr. Moss said, "I am doing it for the people of Paisley. If they want the railroad on this survey I am glad to do what I can to get it there. It hits me pretty hard, and cuts my ranch into three pieces and whether I will make anything out of it or not I don't know, but we need a railroad and if we are going to get one we must all do what we can to help."

With Mr. Moss and his wife leading the way there should be no trouble in getting the rest of those whose land is crossed by the railroad to sign their deeds.

It would not have been unreasonable for Mr. Moss to request the town of Paisley help him bear a part of the burden thus cast upon him but he made no stipulations of this nature. He has said from the start that he was ready to sign his deed at

any time and he has fulfilled his promise.

We congratulate Mr. Moss upon his generosity.

The first deed for right of way was received by the Paisley Commercial Club last Thursday. It was made by D. C. McKissock, who owns a large tract of land at the north end of segregation and the deed is for one half mile of right of way.

The right of way committee is busy with the matter in hand and now that they are at work it will certainly not take them long to complete the work laid out for them by President Strahorn.
