

COUNTY AGRICULTURAL COUNCIL TO ORGANIZE SOON

Meeting to be held in Redmond on June 21—Community Organizations Are in Favor of Move.

Nearly all of the community organizations in the county have written in favor of the organization of a County Agricultural Council and many of these organizations have already elected their delegates to the meeting for this purpose. Every one of the local clubs who have mentioned a choice of meeting place, including those in the eastern section of the county, have named Redmond for this meeting and choice of time has been after the middle of June.

This meeting will therefore, be held at Redmond on June 21st. A short meeting for a discussion of the purposes of the Agricultural Council and questions which it may take in charge will be held at 10.30. The business meeting proper will be held at 1.30 sharp.

Every community with an Improvement Club, Farmers' union, grange or similar organization should have its delegate present to represent them and their views and every community which has not an organization of this kind, should meet and organize and get their delegate elected.

This organization will, or should be the united body through which all the farmers of the county may work for the improvement of their business and conditions affecting them. It should be the strongest and most effective organization in the county and the County Agriculturalist is on hand any anxious to assist in every way possible to make it so.

Don't forget the date, Saturday, June 21st, and see that your community has a representative on hand.
