CO-OPERATIVE COW TESTING ASSOCIATION IS ORGANIZED

Two Hundred and Twenty-Four Cows Signed Up For Testing—Value of Herds to Be Determined.

A meeting of the dairymen interested in the organization of a cow testing association in Crook county was held at the Powell Butte Improvement Club hall on Friday, June 23rd, for the purpose of organization. Twenty four dairymen were present and with the assistance of Prof. F. W. Kehrl, U. S. dairy field agent, and the county agriculturist, an organization was effected. The name chosen for this association is The First Central Oregon Co-operative Cow Testing Association and the officers elected were Henry McCall, president; John Kemmling, vice president; and E. C. Park, secretary-treasurer. The president, vice president and secretary-treasurer compose the executive board of the association.

Members of this association will receive the assistance of an official tester in determining the value of the individual animals composing their herds. Each animal will be tested once each month for one year and actual value of products and expenses together with the profits will be figured monthly and at the end of the year. The cost for this work will be \$1.50 per cow with a minimum herd of eight cows, that is if a herd consists of less than eight cows the expense will be \$12. Where two small herds are located very near each other and owners can arrange milking periods satisfactorily these may be entered as one herd. Thus two near neighbors may enter four or five cows each, thus overcoming the minimum herd charge on a small number of cows, but this arrangement must be made satisfactory to the executive board of the association.

At the date of organization there were 23 members signed up for cows making 21 herds for testing and including 224 cows. There should be 26 working herds to provide employment for the tester all working days of the month so that there is still room at this time for five more herds. The tester will begin work August 1st. For further information write the secretary of the association or the county agriculturist.
