

PLAN ADDITIONS TO FLOUR MILL

NEW WAREHOUSE IS
MODERN

May Soon Erect New Elevator—Farmers May Put Aside Grain Bags For Bulk Method—Sacks Now at Highest Price Ever Known.

When the present improvements and the improvements planned are complete, the Bend Flour Mill Co., will have one of the most up to date flour mill plants in the state.

The new fire proof warehouse is nearing completion and when finished it will be thoroughly sanitary and an ideal storehouse. It is erected of fire proof brick with concrete floors. The flour warehouse will be 30x50 feet. The barley and feed warehouse will be 30x10 feet and the grain warehouse 60x110 feet. All three of these departments will be connected. Products from the mill will be conveyed to their respective departments on belt conveyors.

Improvements Planned.
The feed mill, which is now housed in the main mill will be moved to the north of the main building where a special structure will be built and a huge crib of 60,000 bushels capacity will be constructed.

To Build Elevator.
With the growing demand of the farmers of Central Oregon for grain elevators and granaries to replace the handling of grain in sacks, it is probable that in a short time the mill will commence the erection of an elevator in Bend. The capacity of the initial unit will probably be about 150,000 bushels. Throughout the Madras and Culver sections the farmers are contemplating the early erection of elevators. At Madras the farmers of that locality are contracting for the erection of an elevator to have a capacity of about 100,000 bushels and several of the farmers near Culver are expecting this year to erect individual granaries to store grain in bulk.

This change in the method of handling grain is largely occasioned by the rapid advance in the price of grain bags. The latest quotations received here price grain bags at 14 cents, the highest price ever known. Although the price is expected to fall the quotation is not expected to fall below 12 cents.

DESCHUTES FOREST TO GET \$20,576 FOR IMPROVEMENTS

Considerable Work is Planned for the Coming Year—Expect Bigger Receipts This Year.

With \$20,576, which sum has been recommended to congress as the share of the National Forest appropriation, to be allotted to the Deschutes National Forest for the ensuing fiscal year, for maintenance and improvements, considerable work will be done this summer to make for more efficient service on the forest.

The improvements for which appropriations have been recommended to congress include a cabin at Walker mountain and a bridge at Davis creek which will facilitate travel via Big River to Davis Lake, and a look out station on Maiden Peak. The latter improvement will be one of the features of the forest. The building will be largely enclosed in glass which will enable the ranger stationed there to have an unob-
