

SHEVLIN-HIXON VICTORS 5 TO 4

MILLITES BUNCH HITS AND WIN

In Sunday's Game—Knutsen Pitch-Prineville Saw a Faster Aggregation of Good Ball—Houston Was Hit Demon and Starts Rally.

Pulling up from the rear with a two run lead to overcome, the Shevlin-Hixon nine last Sunday defeated the Prineville nine on the home diamond by a score of 5 to 4. The ceremonies began in the eighth inning when Houston came up to bat. Houston, previously in the game had obtained three hits out of three times up and was ready for a homer which he produced. The hit, by the way, was the longest drive made this year on the local diamond. Then followed White, who hit out a clean right field drive for three bases, and came in on a wild pitch by Burdon. That tied the score. Knutsen on Albee's miff on the third strike, beat the ball to first, went second on Ellis' error and stole third. Tetherow came up and hit a high fly to Dobby in left field and beat the throw to the plate.

In the ninth inning, however, Prineville gave the mill team cause for uneasiness. With two down Bowman got a single and was advanced to third when Lind, with the sun shining directly in his eyes, dropped Estes' fly. Ellis, the next man up, went out Houston to Brain. Fans Get a Treat. Sunday's game was the type of ball that the fans will turn out in congregations to witness. The mill team was able to tighten in p'ches. Prineville scored first when Dobby beat the ball to the ball to the plate on Grebe's high fly to left field. The visitors did not circle the bases again until the sixth inning. In the sixth Estes flew to Tetherow. Ellis got a single and was scored on Burdon's double. Burdon was scored on Marri's single. Prineville scored for the last time in the seventh after Bowman had been walked, and was scored on Ellis' single.

Shevlin-Hixon's first score came in the first inning. Bra'n went first on Ellis' error, was advanced to second on Lind's sacrifice and stole home when Grebe tried to catch Houston off second. The millites scored again in the third with two men down. Lind went first on Ellis' miff and came home on Houston's single. Knutsen Pitches Good Ball. Knutsen, in the box for the mill team, worked like a veteran. He held the visitors to seven hits, and worked finely in tight leacs. His ball was working good and particularly in the last three innings. He faded 12 men and bided his position in fine shape. White, behind the bat, gave Knutsen great support. The mill team was up and coming all the time.

Houston was the hit demon of the game. Of four times up he got two singles, one double and a home run. Burdon, pitching for Prineville, was not up to his usual form in Sunday's game. He struck out only three men, but the six hits that the mill team mustered were fatal.

Said election is called and held for voting upon the adoption or rejection of certain amendments to the charter of the City of Bend, adopted by the common council and referred by the common council to the voters of the city.
 Said proposed amendments are printed in pamphlet form by the city and copies mailed to every legal voter within the city whose address is known, and said pamphlet can be had at the office of the recorder of said city upon application.
 The general purport of each charter amendment is expressed in the ballot title therefor adopted by the common council and which will appear upon the ballot, respectively, in the following words:

REFERRED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL.

"Shall the charter of the city of Bend, Crook County, Oregon, be amended by amending Chapter XXI of said charter by adding thereto a section to be designated 'Section 21,' the provisions of which said section grant to the common council of said city the power to buy, build equip, acquire, lease, own, operate and maintain railways and railroads operated by steam, electric, or other power, within or within and without the boundaries of said city and running from said city to other towns, cities and points without the boundaries of said city, and to acquire rights of way, terminals, easements and real property within and without the boundaries of said city, and to bring actions for the condemnation or taking of private property for public use in the same manner as private corporations are authorized or permitted to do under the laws of the state, and to exercise any one or

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more of said powers, and to borrow money and fund indebtedness in addition to all other indebtedness and without any charter or statutory limit of indebtedness by issuing and selling negotiable warrants or bonds of said city aggregating the principal sum of \$35,000, payable not more than thirty years after their date, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, to provide funds with which to carry out any one or more of the powers granted in said Section 21, and providing a direct annual ad valorem tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds promptly when and as the same become due and to pay the principal thereof at maturity; and repealing all parts of the charter in conflict therewith?"

REFERRED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL.

"Shall the charter of the city of Bend, Crook County, Oregon, be amended by amending Chapter XIX of said charter by adding thereto two sections to be numbered respectively Sections 27 and 28, which sections provide a method for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers therein in said city upon petition of the owners of a majority of the property to be benefited by the contemplated street or sewer improvement, and to be assessed for such improvement; provide for the payment of the cost of any such street or sewer improvement assessed against such property in twenty semi-annual installments with interest at six per centum (6) per annum on all unpaid installments, and the issuance, sale and delivery by the common council upon the application of the owner or owners of the property assessed, of coupon bonds in convenient denominations not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) each, and in an aggregate amount equal to the total amount of the unpaid assessments for such street or sewer improvements, for which applications to pay the same in installments have been filed, which bonds shall mature in ten years from the date thereof, and be redeemable on any interest payment date after one year from the date of said bonds, and bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per centum (6) per annum, payable semi-annually?"
