

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Be it remembered, a regular term of the County Court of Crook county, State of Oregon, was begun and held in the Court house in Prineville, Oregon, on Wednesday, the 5th day of July, the same being the First Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a regular term of said court when were present at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., the following officers: G. Springer, judge, presiding; J. F. Blanchard, Commissioner, H. J. Overturf, Commissioner, Warren Brown, Clerk, E. B. Knox, Sheriff. Whereupon the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the matter of the proposed change in Hugh Lister road No. 1, claim for damages done Mrs. F. A. Powell, presented by her attorney, M. R. Biggs, as follows: \$450.00 in cash for approximately 1/2 acres of land; one stock way on each quarter mile of road through complainant's land, and all necessary fencing—approximately three quarters of a mile. Claim was disallowed.

C. H. Dealy road. Final survey approved. J. N. Williamson being present filed objection to opening of road beyond the south bank of Kitchen Creek. There being no other objection the road ordered opened up to south bank of said creek as a public highway.

Barnes Butte road. County road. Continued till August 7th, 1916.

Tumalo project road No. 1—county road. Continued until August 7, 1916.

Carlin road. Continued till August 7, 1916.

The Dalles-California Highway.—County road. Preliminary hearing held on The Dalles-California highway. Proper notices to property owners appearing; Surveyor's preliminary report approved; no objections being made Co rt ordered surveyor to make final survey forthwith.

Final survey filed and approved. Road ordered opened as a public highway.

Hattie L. Huntington. Claim filed for damage done by The Dalles-California highway crossing her place, in the sum of \$50. Claim allowed and warrant ordered drawn in her favor for that amount in consideration of right of way deed across said place according to survey of said highway.

Hattie L. Huntington. Order clerk to discontinue monthly payments to Hattie L. Huntington until further notice.

In the matter of warrant drawn in favor of J. H. Wenandy for work done on road under supervision of R. H. Bayley. Treasurer ordered to pay warrant.

Coast Bridge Co.—Steel Bridge at Laidlaw. Proposal of Coast Bridge Co. to erect 50 foot span over west branch of Deschutes river at Laidlaw received, and same accepted. See proposal and plans. Price for span \$1830 and concrete used to be charged, at \$11 per cy. under water and \$8 per cy. above.

F. T. Cox—T. B. Cattle—Hearing on claim of F. T. Cox indemnity for slaughter of one Holstein bull under laws of 1913. Proper proof appearing to court by affidavit, order allowing claim for \$37.50 and order warrant drawn in the sum of \$18.75 and instructing clerk to file claim with state for remaining \$18.75.

J. F. Blanchard.—Order warrant drawn for \$2000 for road work to be reported on and accounted for. Class 28, No. 1605.

H. J. Overturf.—Order warrant drawn for \$2000 for road work to be reported on and accounted for. Class 28, No. 1607.

H. G. Kossard.—Water master asked for travelling expenses on official business. Order allowing \$20 per month from April 1 to Oct. 1, and clerk instructed to draw warrant for \$60 to July 1, and \$20 on the first of each month during such period. See claim docket for \$60 due.

Court declares recess till July 10, at 10 a. m.

July 10th, court convenes—same officers present as before.

In the matter of the claim of Adam Kotsman. Claim for \$5 for alleged damages done fences, fields and house by workers on county road filed. Same referred to Commissioner Overturf with power to settle said claims.

Clerks and Judges of election. It is hereby ordered that Clerks and Judges of election in precincts where 125 or less votes are cast be paid \$3 each for their services at each election held in the county; that where more than 125 votes are cast said clerks and judges be paid \$6 each.

County clerk.—Report on coyote bounties paid in May, \$149.50 and June \$94.50. Said report accepted and ordered filed.

County clerk.—The following warrants appearing to have been issued more than seven years and uncalced for the same are hereby ordered canceled.

Murphy and Murphy—Communi-

Laidlaw Committee.—Committee representing Laidlaw represented that the bridge across east branch of Deschutes river at Laidlaw was in a dangerous condition and asked that a permanent bridge be built. The Coast Bridge Co. notified to send representative to meet at bridge site Wednesday morning July 12th to make estimate and decide on type of bridge with court. Purchase of said bridge to be made on said date.

F. G. Powers.—Petition for rebate on taxes presented and disallowed on account of insufficient proof of statements set up in petition. See petition.

July 11th court convened at 7:45 a. m. Same officers present as previous day except G. Springer, judge. In the matter of Paulina Supply and Commission store.—Petition for damages to truck on account of unsafe bridge on county road denied. See petition.

RAILROAD WAGES

Shall they be determined by Industrial Warfare or Federal Inquiry?

To the American Public:

Do you believe in arbitration or industrial warfare?

The train employes on all the railroads are voting whether they will give their leaders authority to tie up the commerce of the country to enforce their demands for a 100 million dollar wage increase.

The railroads are in the public service—your service. This army of employes is in the public service—your service.

You pay for rail transportation 3 billion dollars a year, and 44 cents out of every dollar from you goes to the employes.

On all the Western railroads in 1915, seventy-five per cent of the train employes earned these wages (lowest, highest and average of all) as shown by the pay rolls—

A 100 million dollar wage increase for men in freight and yard service (less than one-fifth of all employes) is equal to a 5 per cent advance in all freight rates.

The managers of the railroads, as trustees for the public, have no right to place this burden on the cost of transportation to you without a clear mandate from a public tribunal speaking for you.

The railroads have proposed the settlement of this controversy either under the existing national arbitration law, or by reference to the Interstate Commerce Commission. This offer has been refused by the employes' representatives.

Shall a nation-wide strike or an investigation under the Government determine this issue?
