

# BEND DEFEATS MILL TEAM 7-3

## LOCAL NINE PLAYED FAST BALL

Tetherow Given Fine Support—Holds Shevlin-Hixon Team to Eight Hits—Knaudson Pounded for 15 Hits But Fanned Twelve Men.

Playing almost errorless ball, and hitting when hits were needed to score, the Bend nine hooked one over on the Shevlin-Hixon nine Sunday afternoon by a score of 7 to 3. Bend played genuine ball behind Tetherow who, until the eighth inning, held the mill team to two ineffective hits. Bend opened in a whirlwind. Horton up first, picked out the first one for a single and stole third. Smith, of Burns, struck out. Tetherow hit a double and scored Horton, and Woods took the first ball and hit a single, scoring Tetherow. Bend did not register again until the seventh. Blake fanned. Steidl hit for a single and Horton went first on a bunt that was poorly handled by White to Brain. Smith got a single, scoring Steidl and Horton. O'Donnell came up and singled, scoring Smith. In the eighth, Blake, who went first on a felder's choice, came home on Baker's error on Horton's grounder. Tetherow scored Smith in the ninth on a three bagger.

Shevlin-Hixon was held scoreless until the eighth. Baker hit a two bagger and was scored on Moe's single. In the ninth Brain was first up and singled. Lind struck out and Houston singled, scoring Brain. Then White doubled, scoring Houston. Knaudson flew to Smith and Bolland went out Smith to Steidl.

Tetherow's splitter was working in the shape Sunday. The heavy waders of the stick had a great deal of difficulty until the eighth in connecting with the sphere. Until the ninth only two little hits were chalked up against Tetherow. The infield worked like a charm all the way through the game, snapping the ball.

Knaudson did not have the stuff on the ball that he did a week ago against Prineville, and was found for 15 hits. He struck out 12 men, but could not tighten up sufficiently in pinches.

During his trip through Eastern Oregon late this summer Mr. Sinnott intends to arrange with various interested persons for the collection of jackrabbit skins and he will also endeavor meantime to arrange with various factories to make experiments.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the City of Bend, Crook County, Oregon, on Tuesday, to-wit: the 15th day of August, A. D. 1916, between the hours of 8 a. m. and 8 p. m. The voting precincts in said city for said election shall be the same as the precincts at the general election of city officers, and the said precincts and the polling places in each are designated as follows:

Precinct 3; Polling place: Council Chamber.

Precinct 4; Polling place: Reid school.

Precinct 5; Polling place: Harvey De Armond Garage, cor. Greenwood and 3rd.

Said election is called and held for voting upon the adoption or rejection of certain amendments to the charter of the City of Bend, adopted by the common council and referred by the common council to the voters of the city.

Said proposed amendments are printed in pamphlet form by the city and copies mailed to every legal voter within the city whose address is known, and said pamphlet can be had at the office of the recorder of said city upon application.

The general purport of each charter amendment is expressed in the ballot title therefor adopted by the common council and which will appear upon the ballot, respectively, in the following words:

REFERRED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL

"Shall the charter of the city of Bend, Crook County, Oregon, be amended by amending Chapter XXI of said charter by adding thereto a section to be designated 'Section 21,' the provisions of which said section grant to the common council of said city the power to buy, build equip, acquire, lease, own, operate and maintain railways and railroads operated by steam, electric, or other power, within or without and without the boundaries of said city and run-

ning from said city to other towns, cities and points without the boundaries of said city, and to acquire rights of way, terminals, easements and real property within and without the boundaries of said city, and to bring actions for the condemnation or taking of private property for public use in the same manner as private corporations are authorized or permitted to do under the laws of the state, and to exercise any one or more of said powers, and to borrow money and fund indebtedness in addition to all other indebtedness and without any charter or statutory limit of indebtedness by issuing and selling negotiable warrants or bonds of said city aggregating the principal sum of \$35,000, payable not more than thirty years after their date, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, to provide funds with which to carry out any one or more of the powers granted in said Section 21, and providing a direct annual ad valorem tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds promptly when and as the same become due and to pay the principal thereof at maturity; and repealing all parts of the charter in conflict therewith?"

REFERRED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL

"Shall the charter of the city of Bend, Crook County, Oregon, be amended by amending Chapter XIX of said charter by adding thereto two sections to be numbered respectively Sections 27 and 28, which sections provide a method for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers therein in said city upon petition of the owners of a majority of the property to be benefited by the contemplated street or sewer improvement, and to be assessed for such improvement; provide for the payment of the cost of any such street or sewer improvement assessed against such property in twenty semi-annual installments with interest at six per centum (6) per annum on all unpaid installments, and the issuance, sale and delivery by the common council upon the application of the owner or owners of the property assessed, of coupon bonds in convenient denominations not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) each, and in an aggregate amount equal to the total amount of the unpaid assessments for such street or sewer improvements, for which applications to pay the same in installments have been filed, which bonds shall mature in ten years from the date thereof, and be redeemable on any interest payment date after one year from the date of said bonds, and bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per centum (6) per annum, payable semi-annually?"
